OPEN SESSION

Agenda Item 1 – Call the meeting to Order / Roll Call / Pledge of Allegiance

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 a.m. and a quorum was present.

Agenda Item 2 – Chairman’s Opening Remarks

The Chair did not have any statements.

Agenda Item 3 – Approval of May 16, 2014 Commission Meeting Minutes

Commissioner Lehman requested minor revisions regarding Agenda Item 4 - Budget Update to spell out Commissioner Shen-Urquidez, which had been abbreviated.

Commissioner Lehman motioned to approve the minutes as revised; Chair Frierson seconded the motion. The motion passed 6-0 by roll call.

Agenda Item 4 – Executive Officer's Report

a. Budget Update

Executive Officer (EO) Andy Foster presented his budget report, stating that the winter months are tough for the Commission in terms of revenue. He explained that he anticipates December revenue to be around 40K.

Commissioner Carvelli stated that the fund is at a 6.4 month reserve and congratulated the EO for this. He further stated that this was a goal given to the Commission by the Director of DCA and the Commission was successful in reaching this goal.

The EO stated that UFC will be having a major event in February 28, 2015, at the Staples Center in Los Angeles. The EO is confident that despite the declines in the winter, March 2015 and April 2015 will bring in enough revenue to help the deficits we may run in the winter months.

The EO stated that we have exceeded our drug testing allowance for this year, however, we have made adjustments in other areas to make up for this. The EO pointed out that the Commission will regulate less events for this year mainly because the Commission has more televised events scheduled this year, as well as the delegation of amateur kickboxing to IKF.

Chair Frierson stated that he would like to hear the announcers at events state that the proceeding is a California fight. The EO stated that he has now made this a policy for all Lead Inspectors to ensure.

The EO stated that the Commission has exceeded the Attorney General line item due to pending litigation.

b. Report of Pending Regulations

The EO briefly explained this agenda item and asked the Assistant Executive Officer (AEO), Sophia Cornejo, to speak on each specific pending regulation. The AEO outlined the current status of each pending regulation and explained that there will be some follow up with the Department on the status of the regulation packages that are at agency for approval.

Agenda Item 5 – Presentation by Mr. Cyril Shaw with Raymond James Financial Services, Inc.

Mr. Cyril Shaw of Raymond James Financial Services, Inc. presented to the Commission a summary and publication on the services provided by Raymond James Financial Services.

Agenda Item 6 – Presentation by Ms. Beth Harrington of Benefit Resources, LLC.

Ms. Beth Harrington of Benefit Resources presented to the Commissioners a summary of the services provided by Benefit Resources. Commissioner Lehman requested Ms. Harrington to provide more information with regard to projections at future meetings.

Agenda Item 7 – Report regarding weight cutting from Association of Ringside Physicians' Conference and possible revision of weigh-in regulations and update of CSAC License Applications

The EO presented this agenda item and recommended that the Commission include an attachment to the Athlete licensing application an information flyer explaining the dangers in

weight-cutting. The EO explained that once the flier is created and approved by legal, the Commission can vote on approving the attachment. The EO explained that he proposed the NCAA caliper test to be used on athletes to determine body fat percentage and establish a healthy weight.

Commissioner Lemons stated that this is a good first step but far from ideal because it still allows people to use dehydration to lose weight rather than fat weight. He also stated that this test can easily be manipulated. He further explained the reasons why and the ways that athletes are capable of cheating this test. He concluded that he does not see this as an ideal resolution.

The EO stated that he has experienced some industry push-back on this proposal. He explained that there needs to be a change and it can be California leading the change. He anticipates that once we provide this information, and industry is made fully aware of the dangers, support will come; at that point the Commission will approach the stakeholders for support on the proposal, which will help in the last step of proposing changes in the regulations.

It is the EO's fear that there will be dire consequences if the Commission allows current practices to continue. He further stated that the Commission needs to be committed to this change because it will be a long process with little support from industry. Commissioner Lemons stated again that this proposal is an excellent first step.

Chair Frierson asked if most of the ringside physicians at the conference agreed with this proposal. Commissioner Lemons stated that there was universal agreement as well as collective concern. Chair Frierson inquired about how the EO plans to approach the industry regarding this proposal. The EO stated that a majority of promoters want healthy fighters. He further stated that he can point out to them that serious revenue has been lost due to unhealthy weight cutting. However, the safety of the athletes is still the Commission's number one concern.

Commissioner Giza commended the EO for making this effort and acknowledged that this is a great first step in the right direction.

The EO suggested that at the next commission meeting he can present a one page document which will be included with the athlete license application.

The AEO further explained that as long as this attachment to the license application is strictly informational and we are not enforcing anything, then regulations are not necessary. Once we make a change to weigh-in procedures and enforcement, regulations will be required.

Agenda Item 8 – Certification of Ringside Physicians

The EO presented the list of current Ringside Physicians and requested that the Commissioners certify the list of Ringside Physicians.

Vice-chair Carvelli motioned to certify the list and Commission Lemons seconded the motion.

Commissioner Giza asked the EO to explain what the qualifications are to be a Ringside Physician. The EO read the regulation that outlines the qualifications for approved Ringside Physicians.

The motion passed 6-0 with a roll call vote.

Agenda Item 9 – Awards of Recognition for 2014

Chair Frierson tabled this item to the next Commission Meeting.

Agenda Item 10 – Review and approval of modifications to the Neurological Assessment proposed regulation language.

The AEO presented this agenda item and explained that a vote will not be required at this time because there will be additional changes made to the language which will include what was intended by section 18711 of the Business and Professions Code, specifically, the medical examinations that are required by licensees and the timeframes in which they are required. The modified language will be presented to the Commission at a special meeting sometime in January 2015 or at the next regular scheduled Commission Meeting in February.

SUBJECT	Fiscal Year (FY) 2014-15 & 2015-16 – Budget Information

The subject documentation is attached for your information and provides revised FY 2014-15 and proposed FY 2015-16 budget data. The information is consistent with the recently released FY 2015-16 Governor's Budget Proposal. A summary of the data provided is as follows:

- **FY 2015-16 Proposed Governor's Budget** – Printouts of your board/bureau/program's budget can be found posted on the Department of Finance's (DOF) website at www.ebudget.ca.gov.
- **Budget Summary**. This one-page summary displays all changes to your CY 2014-15 and proposed BY 2015-16 budgets. The document identifies your FY 2014-15 and 2015-16 "base" funding levels and the specific budget/funding adjustments (some affecting both current and budget year), and provides final budget totals for the current (i.e., CY stone) and proposed 2015-16 Governor's Budget.
- **Current and Budget Year Worksheets**. These are internal working documents used in adjusting your current year (CY) and budget year (BY) budgets by line item. The "budget stone" column on the CY worksheet reflects your final budget for the CY. The same column on your BY worksheet reflects your proposed budget for the BY, as it is displayed in the Governor's Budget.
- **Fund Condition Statement (FCs)** -- This document incorporates projected revenue for CY 2014-15 and BY 2015-16, based on the workload, expenditure, and revenue information prepared by your program staff (including applicable General Fund loans and/or repayments). The FC also incorporates your current and budget year budgets, as reflected in the Governor's Budget.

- **Expenditure and Revenue Projections** -- These documents display the budget and projected line item expenditures and revenue, by line item, for the CY based on the first six months of operation.

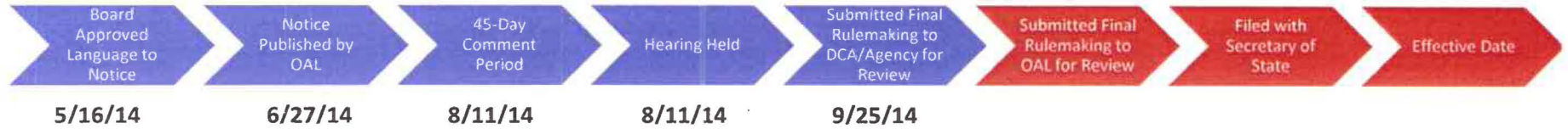

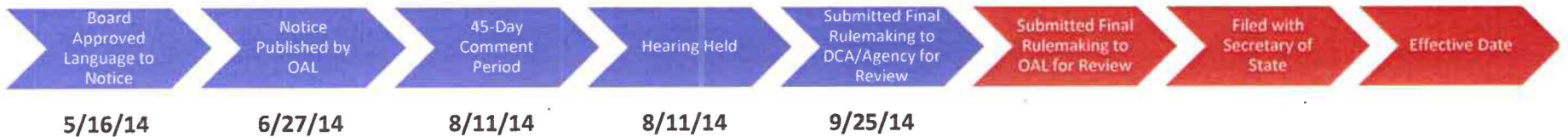

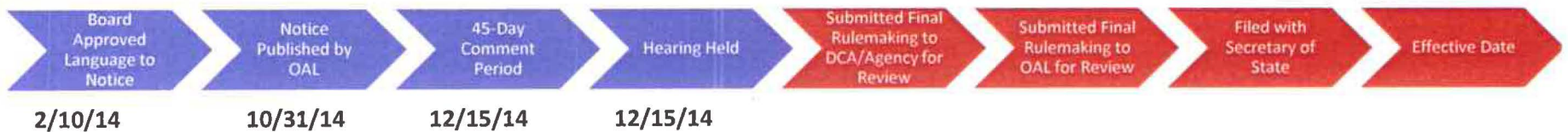

Re: Notice of Petition for Change of Decision

We act as legal counsel for Mr. Tyson Cave with respect to this matter and write to provide you notice of Mr. Cave's petition for Change of Decision pursuant to § 386(a)(3) under Title 4, Division 2, Chapter 1, Article 8 of the *California Code of Regulations* for the California State Athletic Commission ("the Commission").

Mr. Cave petitions the Commission to conduct a thorough investigation and change the decision of a boxing contest held on Thursday, December 11, 2014 in Temecula, California, in which Oscar Escandon was awarded the World Boxing Association's (WBA) interim super-bantamweight title in a split decision. Mr. Cave petitions the Commission to change the decision and rule that Mr. Cave was the winning contestant pursuant to § 386(a)(2) and (3) on the basis that two of the three judges, Raul Caiz Jr. and Tony Krebs erroneously judged and incorrectly scored the match.

In the alternative, Mr. Cave petitions the Commission to change the decision and rule that the match was a "no contest."

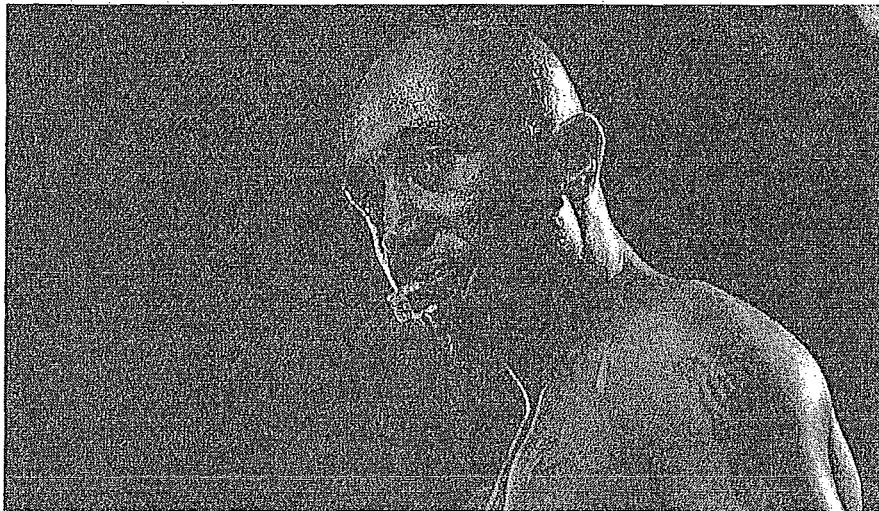

Outrage spreads in boxing circles after Halifax's Tyson Cave 'robbed' of title

The headlines screamed what Tyson Cave didn't Friday.

One bellowed that Cave had been "blatantly robbed of interim world title."

Boxing commentator Teddy Atlas, in a rant that may reverberate around boxing for years to come, called the decision a "sham" and a "crime." He pleaded that somebody in power save a slumping pro boxing industry from corruption before there's nothing left to corrupt.

At the centre of the fury was Halifax's Cave, who dominated Colombia's Oscar Escandon over 12 rounds on Thursday night in California for the WBA interim super bantamweight title.

However, Cave lost a split decision that was the talk of boxing on Friday.

Atlas, broadcasting for ESPN, scored the bout 118-110 for Cave. An online fan vote had Cave winning every round.

Cave threw more punches and carried the action against Escandon, who wasn't quick enough to cut off the ring to keep his prey within striking distance.

It would have been a world title of sorts for Cave. The interim belt is a sanctioned title within the WBA and would have put him in line to fight the WBA's regular champion, England's Scott Quigg, in a unification bout.

The Cave camp petitioned both the WBA and the California State Athletic Commission for redress on Friday. It's not known how, or when, the process might play out.

"I don't know what else I could have done better," Cave said Friday morning before catching a flight for home. "I stayed with him, I out-boxed him, I out-punched him."

Atlas wasn't alone in his indignation when the scores were called. Raul Caiz Jr.'s tabulation that Escandon won 117-111 drew the loudest gasps, while the other two judges split their cards 115-113.

Sampson Lewkowicz, the promoter for both fighters in the contest, immediately called for a rematch.

Cave received calls of support from powerful names in the boxing establishment, including Lennox Lewis, Micky Ward and Amir Khan. Atlas came to Cave's hotel room after the fight to tell him he would back him in a protest.

"A lot of the world was watching to see who I was," said the 33-year-old Cave, who was making his U.S. debut, as was Escandon. "I think they'll know who I am. I made the (WBA No. 2) guy look like an amateur, I thought."

It was a rematch from a decade ago when the two fought on the trail to the 2004 Olympics in Athens. Cave lost that one, too, in a contest he still believes he won.

Cave might have been on firm ground Friday complaining about corruption in his profession, but he didn't. He'd like some answers, but won't pre-judge an inquiry.

"I got what I wanted," he said. "I think I have respect now. I think people respect me enough to know I am the real deal."

As for a rematch, he'd consider it, but would want "neutral ground."

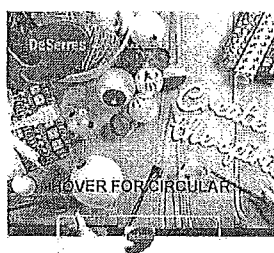
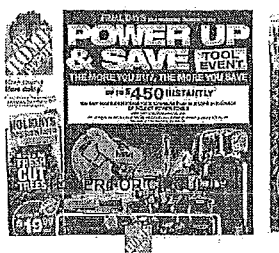
"He's taken from me and my family twice," he said. "I feel worse this time. But the great thing about this is it was on TV. So everyone saw this time.

"I just want to go home now and see my family and I'll be back in the gym on Monday. I have to train even harder because now I've got to figure out how to knock people out. I guess just beating them up for 12 rounds isn't good enough any more."

Official Review of Escandon vs. Cave Scoring

The Pod Index, LLC conducted an official scoring review of the December 11th WBA Super Bantamweight Title bout between Oscar Escandon and Tyson Cave at the Pechanga Casino in California. The three assigned judges scored the fight as follows:

Raul Caiz, Jr. 117-111 for Escandon
Tony Crebs 115-113 for Escandon
Max DeLuca 115-113 for Cave

Five experienced boxing judges were asked to score the fight on TV with the sound muted. The chart below compares the scores of all eight judges. Four of the five review judges scored the fight in favor of Cave, while one judge had it a draw.

Round by Round Analysis

Round 1: This round was split even four to four. Tony Crebs was in the minority of the three ringside judges but was supported by three of the five review judges.

Round 2: Seven judges awarded this round to Cave. Only Caiz, Jr. scored it for Escandon.

Round 3: Tony Crebs was in the minority of the three ringside judges and was only supported by one review judge.

Round 4: Max DeLuca was in the minority of the three ringside judges, but he was supported by all five review judges who scored it for Cave.

Round 5: In this round, all three ringside judges scored it for Escandon. However, four of the five review judges awarded it to Cave. This round may have looked significantly different on television vs. ringside.

Round 6: Six judges scored this round for Tyson Cave. Tony Crebs was in the minority.

Round 7: Tony Crebs scored this round for Cave, putting him in the minority of the ringside judges. But he had support from four of the five review judges.

Round 8: Similarly, DeLuca, who scored this round for Cave was in the minority of the ringside judges, but had support from four of the five review judges.

Round 9: Seven of the eight judges scored this round for Tyson Cave. Only Tony Crebs awarded it to Escandon.

Round 10: Again DeLuca was in the minority of ringside judges by scoring the round for Cave, but all five review judges agreed that Cave had the edge.

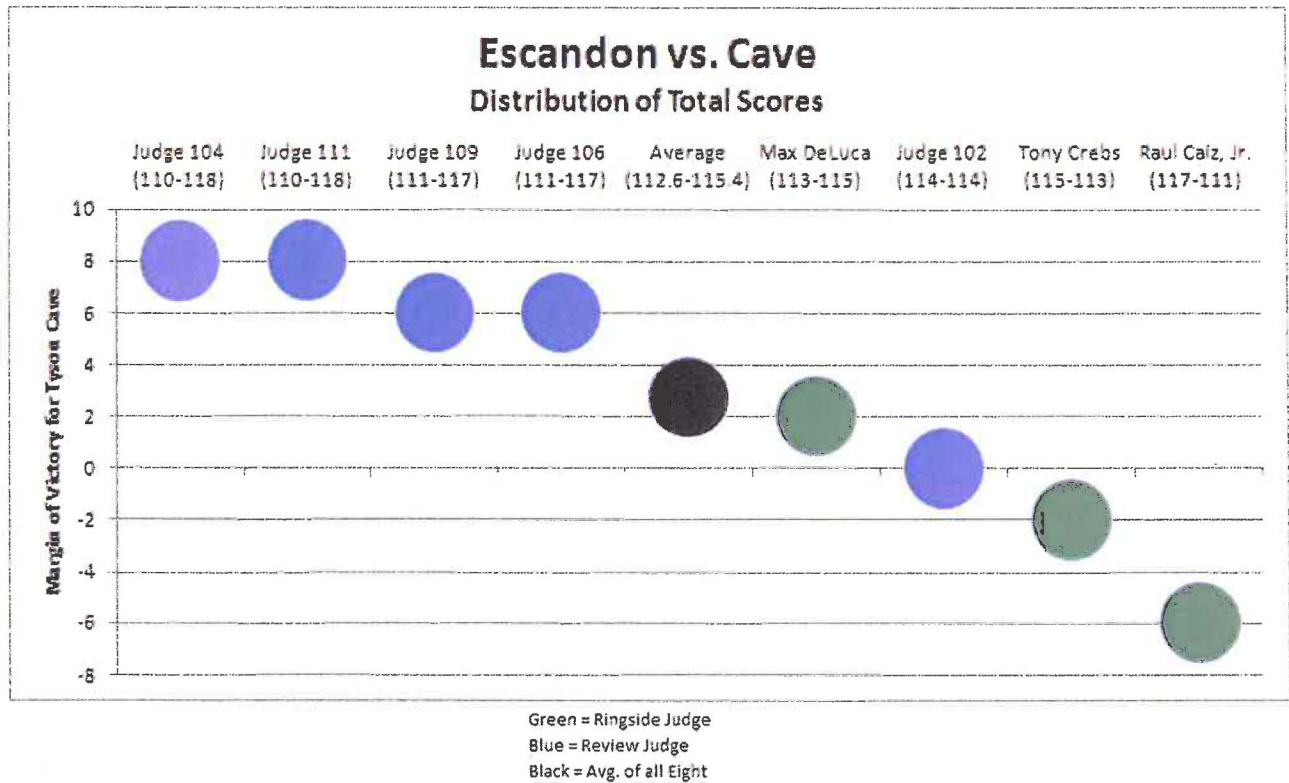
Round 11: Seven judges awarded this round to Tyson Cave, including all three ringside judges. Only judge #104 dissented.

Round 12: In the only unanimous round, all eight judges scored it for Escandon.



Distribution of Total Scores

Overall, the average score of the eight judges was 115.4 - 112.6 for Tyson Cave. Of the three ringside judges, Max DeLuca's score of 115-113 for Cave was the closest to the average. While Raul Caiz, Jr.'s score was the farthest from the average. Based upon the Pod Index's criteria when comparing eight judges' scores, Caiz, Jr.'s score is considered "extreme".





Summary and Analysis

The three ringside judges were in agreement in only three rounds (5, 11, and 12). Of the nine split rounds, the judge that was in the ringside minority was clearly supported by the review judges five times. That leaves four rounds in which the minority ringside judge was in the “true minority”:

Round 2: Caiz, Jr.’s score for Escandon was outnumbered **seven to one**

Round 3: Creb’s score for Cave was outnumbered **six to two**

Round 6: Creb’s score for Escandon was outnumber **six to two**

Round 9: Creb’s score for Escandon was outnumbered **seven to one**

Of the nine rounds in which the ringside judges were split:

Raul Caiz, Jr. scored seven rounds in favor of Escandon

Tony Crebs scored five rounds for Tyson Cave

Max DeLuca scored six rounds for Tyson Cave

Another fact worth noting is the split of scores amongst the five review judges, all of whom had the exact same vantage point (muted television replay). Four of the five review judges had Cave winning either nine or ten rounds. While one review judge awarded six rounds a piece. In the review judges’ comments, a vast majority of rounds were indicated as “close” while only a handful were noted as “moderate”. This demonstrates that this fight had many “truly close” rounds in which an intrinsic and subconscious style preference was a key driver in the awarding of these “truly close” rounds. Four of the five review judges may have preferred Cave’s unorthodox style, which included boxing from the outside, a lot of movement, and punching from odd angles. Raul Caiz, Jr. may have preferred Escandon’s more traditional come-forward style, which included 250 jabs thrown, as compared to only 42 jabs thrown for Cave.

We recommend, as a learning exercise, to ask Raul Caiz, Jr. to rescore round two from the below video link with the sound muted. Ask him to provide detailed comments on the round.

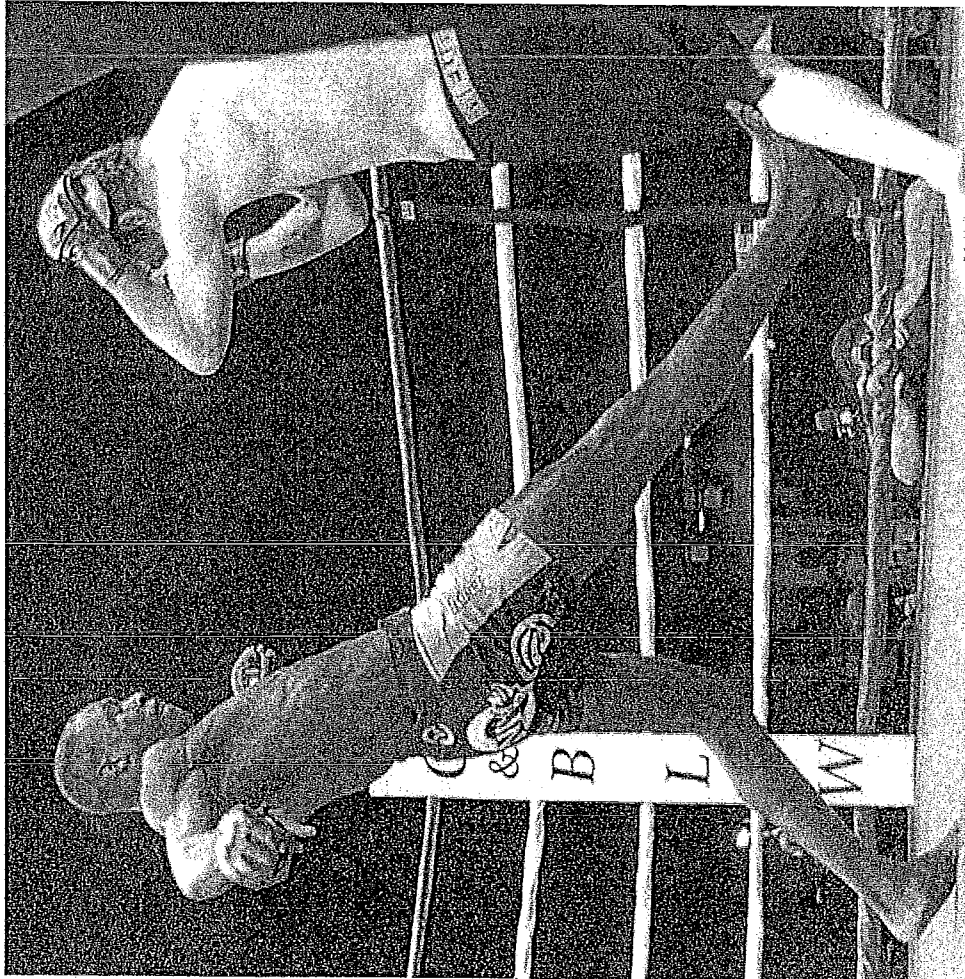
On Thursday October 16, 2014 on the Orange County Fight Club card, promoted by Roy Englebrecht and matchmaker Mel Valenzuela, I, James Chaney fought in an MMA match vs. Curtis Millender as the co-main event for the Welterweight title. At approximately one minute into the first round, Curtis Millender delivered a lateral kick to the front of my knee, collapsing it and tearing my MCL.

To be clear, this was a Muay Thai style push kick delivered with purposeful, ill intent, causing a potentially career ending injury. This kick, delivered in this way, has always been completely illegal to my knowledge. When my coach from the Mayweather Gym asked CSAC representatives about the legality of the kick they said it was completely illegal. Others indicated that it had recently become legal ONLY in California, in which my coaches demanded to see the rules on the spot. A CSAC official said they would show us the rules after the show, but ultimately failed to do so.

Under CSAC rules of fouls 522 number 11 (linear kicks to the front or side of the knees) and 7 (any unsportsmanlike trivk or action that causes any injury to an opponent or referee) as written, it specifically says that a linear kick to the knee is illegal and video will clearly show malicious & purposeful intent. This was not only fight ending, but potentially career ending. Attached is a photo from the CSAC website stating these rules and a photo VERY clearly showing the kick being administered.



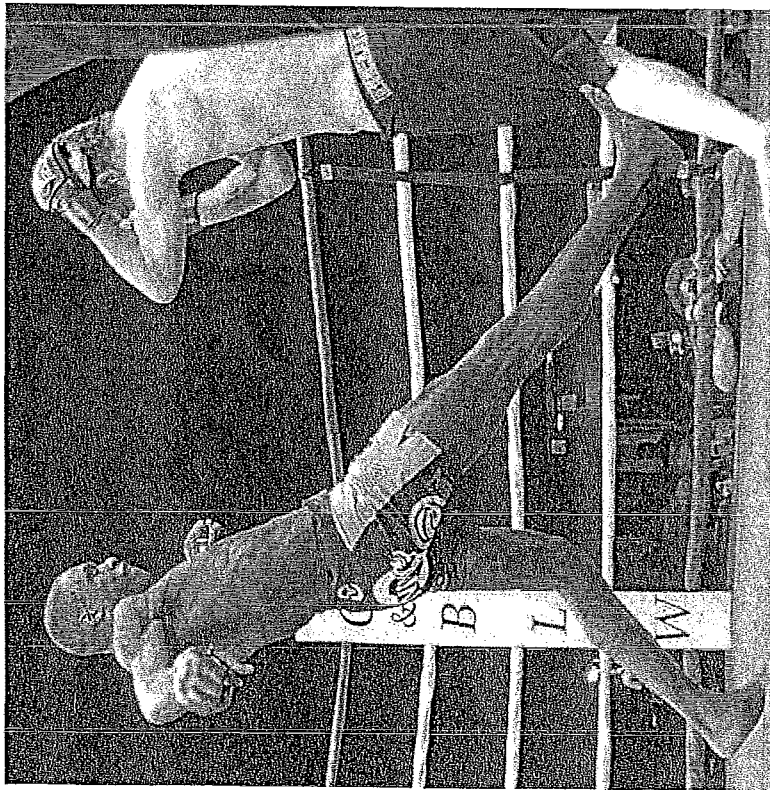

§ 522. Fouls.

(a) Fouls in kickboxing and martial arts. The following tactics are fouls in both kickboxing and martial arts and are forbidden. Use of these tactics shall result in a warning and loss of points as determined by the referee.

- (1) Headbutts.
- (2) Striking downward using point of the elbow.
- (3) Openhand attacks to the eyes or throat or eye gouging.
- (4) Striking at that part of the body over the kidney or spine or chopping or striking the back of the neck or head.
- (5) Spitting, or, in the referee's discretion, slapping.
- (6) The use of abusive language in the ring.
- (7) Any unsportsmanlike trick or action that causes any injury to an opponent or referee.
- (8) Attacking on the break.
- (9) Attacking after the bell or gong has sounded ending the round, or when the opponent is out of the ring.
- (10) Intentionally pushing, shoving or wrestling an opponent out of the ring with any part of the body.
- (11) Linear kicks to the front or side of the knees.
- (12) Continuous dropping of mouthpiece.
- (13) Intentional evasion of contact.
- (14) Hair pulling.
- (15) Attacking or obstructing the trachea.
- (16) Clawing, pinching or twisting the flesh or grabbing the clavicle.
- (17) Pulling or holding uniform below hipline.
- (18) Holding ropes or fence.
- (19) Small joint manipulation (e.g. twisting of fingers or toes).
- (20) Groin attacks.
- (21) Fish hooks.
- (22) Biting.

(b) Fouls in kickboxing. The following tactics are fouls in kickboxing and are forbidden. Use of these tactics shall result in a warning and loss of points as determined by the referee.

- (1) Arm bars.
- (2) Grabbing or holding onto an opponent's leg or foot, and grabbing or holding onto any other part of the body.

CALIFORNIA STATE ATHLETIC COMMISSION

Adopt Subdivision (c) and (d) of Section 280 of Article 6 of Division 2 of Title 4 of the California Code of Regulations to read as follows:

ARTICLE 6. PHYSICAL EXAMINATIONS AND SAFETY

§ 280. Examination Of Boxer Applicants.

(a) Any boxer applying for a license or renewal thereof shall be examined by a physician currently licensed by this state to establish both physical and mental fitness for competition. Such examination shall be taken at such time as directed by the commission. Any boxer licensed by the commission who participates in a boxing match or contest outside the State of California may be required, upon his return to California, to again take this examination before being allowed to box in California. The results of such contests shall be reported to the nearest commission office by the licensee within 72 hours of his return to California.

(b) An examination of an applicant or licensee may be accepted by the commission if it is performed by a physician authorized to perform such examinations by the state or nation in which the examination is conducted and if it is conducted in accordance with commission instructions, including the use of applicable forms prescribed by the commission.

(c) Any boxer applying for a license or renewal shall be required to submit to and complete a medical examination process, which shall include the following:

1. Neurological Examination must be performed by a licensed physician that specializes in neurology or neurosurgery. This examination is valid for 12 months.
2. Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI) shall be completed by a licensed neurologist or neurosurgeon.
3. Electrocardiogram (EKG) must be performed by a licensed physician. This medical test is only required once, unless it appears to the commission there is a risk of cognitive impairment.
4. Physical Examination must be performed by a licensed physician and is valid for 12 months.
5. Eye Examination must be performed by a licensed ophthalmologist or licensed optometrist and must meet the requirements set forth in Section 282, Article 6 of the California Code of Regulations. This examination is valid for 12 months.

6. The following required blood tests shall be taken within 30 days of the date of application and are valid for 6 months:

(A) Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) Antibody

(B) Hepatitis B Surface Antigen (HBsAg):

(C) Hepatitis C Virus (HCV)

(d) The laboratory that administered the required blood tests shall be certified in accordance with the Federal Clinical Laboratory Improvement Act. The results of each blood test shall be submitted to the commission on the letterhead of the laboratory that administered them.

(e) The examining physician may recommend any additional tests or evaluations he or she deems necessary, as specified in Business and Professions Code section 18711.

(f) The commission may waive the requirement for a brain imaging scan or an EKG if a brain imaging scan or EKG was completed as part of the licensing requirements in another state, as specified in Business and Professions Code section 18711.

(g) The commission may, in its discretion, accept tests or evaluations that are equivalent to those described in subdivision (c) and that have been completed within one year of licensure.

(e)(h) In accordance with section 18711 of the Business and Professions Code, the commission shall collect from each promoter of professional matches licensed under the State Athletic Commission Act one hundred and seventy five dollars (\$175) per event sanctioned by the commission until the State Athletic Commission Neurological Examination Account balance falls below one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000). At that point, the amount of the assessment shall be re-examined by the commission. The manner in which the assessment is collected shall be at the discretion of the commission and shall be deposited in and credited to the State Athletic Commission Neurological Examination Account and shall be used to pay for the costs of neurological examinations required by section 18711 ~~or for any other purpose related to the neurological health of combat sports athletes and authorized by the California State Athletic Commission Boxing Act.~~

NOTE: Authority cited: Section 18611, Business and Professions Code.
Reference: Sections 18640, 18642, 18661 and 18711, Business and Professions Code.

AGENDA ITEM 12

CALIFORNIA STATE ATHLETIC COMMISSION

Adopt Sections 424 of Article 14 of Division 2 of Title 4 of the California Code of Regulations to read as follows:

ARTICLE 14. THERAPEUTIC USE EXEMPTION

§424. Requirements for Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE)

- (a) It is each athlete's personal duty to ensure that no prohibited substance enters his or her body. Athletes are responsible for any Prohibited Substance or its Metabolites or Markers found to be present in their Samples. All athletes licensed by the commission may be required to submit to testing for prohibited substances at any time whether in or out of competition and whether or not they have a competition scheduled. Athletes with documented medical conditions requiring the use of a Prohibited Substance or a Prohibited Method in any event sanctioned by the commission or its authorized amateur sanctioning bodies shall request a Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE) from the commission. The request shall be made by submitting to the commission an application for "Therapeutic Use Exemption Application" (Revised 1/2014) which is hereby incorporated by reference.
- (b) This Article shall apply equally to foreign and non-resident athletes who are licensed by the commission.
- (c) "Prohibited substance" is defined as those substances specified in the Prohibited List of the World Anti-Doping Code, as promulgated by the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA).
- (d) The Prohibited List shall be the most current list of prohibited substances. A list of prohibited substances may be provided to an athlete with the application for a TUE.
- (e) Athletes may apply to the commission for a TUE for any substance at any time. However, such applications must be complete and received by the commission at least twenty-one (21) days in advance of any use prohibited in sport. The time period required by this subdivision shall not apply to applicants applying for a retroactive approval.
- (f) Applications for a TUE will not be considered for retroactive approval except in cases where:
- (1) Emergency treatment or treatment of an acute medical condition was necessary, or

(2) Exceptional circumstances existed, sufficiency of which shall be determined at the sole discretion of the commission.

(g) Each of the following shall accompany the application for Determination of Therapeutic Use Exemption:

(1) Medical work-up, which shall include:

- (a) Etiology based upon the treating physicians evaluation. For testosterone, the criteria established in the Therapeutic Use Exemption Guidelines, as promulgated by WADA, shall apply.
- (b) An evaluation by a board-certified physician in the appropriate medical field.
- (c) Patient medical history, which must be consistent with the standard of practice in the appropriate medical field relevant to the exemption requested. For testosterone, the endocrinologist must include all items listed in the current Therapeutic Use Exemption Guidelines, as published by WADA.
- (d) A physical exam, which must be consistent with the standard of practice in the appropriate medical field relevant to the exemption requested. For testosterone, the endocrinologist must include all items listed in the current Therapeutic Use Exemption Guidelines, as published by WADA.
- (e) A testing/laboratory evaluation, which must be consistent with the standard of practice in the appropriate medical field relevant to the exemption requested. For testosterone, the endocrinologist must include all items listed in the current Therapeutic Use Exemption Guidelines, as published by WADA.
- (f) Pre Fight - Lab data for the therapeutic agent in question. For testosterone or its equivalent and sex hormone binding globulin (SHBG), lab data levels drawn during the past 6 months prior to a fight including one value within one month of the fight. Athletes should not have testosterone levels above the normal range or SHBG levels below normal. If a value is found to be out of the normal range, the athlete's provider should take action to correct the level by repeating the lab and/or adjusting medication appropriately, which should be documented in the records submitted to the commission. Repeat elevated testosterone levels (x2) during the 6 months prior to the fight will

be grounds for disqualification evaluated on a case by case basis by the commission. The day prior to the fight, the athlete should submit the time, date, amount and method of the last dose of testosterone or other medication administered.

(g) Day of Fight – Lab data for the therapeutic agent in question. Agent specific levels shall be drawn on the day of Fight. For Testosterone its equivalent and SHBG level, will also be drawn on the day of Fight. Any level of testosterone above the normal range may subject the athlete to disciplinary action. Testosterone injections should be dosed appropriately to avoid peak levels above the normal range during testing.

(2) A copy of the medical records in which the applicant's medical condition is well documented, which must reflect that the condition existed prior to any test for a TUE was performed;

(3) Declaration under penalty of perjury of a board certified physician in the appropriate field of medicine, in good standing, attesting that he/she has read and understood the requirements for a Therapeutic Use Exemption and the most current Therapeutic Use Exemption Guidelines as published by WADA, examined the athlete, and the athlete qualifies for an exemption. The most current Therapeutic Use Exemption Guidelines, may be provided to an applicant with the application for TUE. An applicant for a TUE shall bear the sole responsibility of providing the guidelines to their evaluating physician.

(4) A copy of the medical records in which the applicant's medical condition is well documented, which must reflect that the condition existed prior to the date any test for a TUE was performed;

(5) Diagnosis;

(6) Name of the prohibited substance(s);

(7) Dose to be taken;

(8) Method of administration;

(9) Duration of treatment;

(10) Name and contact details of the applicant's treating physician.

(h) The applicant, at the applicant's expense, shall promptly undergo any additional medical examination and testing requested by the commission, including, but not

limited to, being examined and/or tested by one or more physicians designated at the sole discretion of the commission.

- (i) The commission shall determine based upon the facts and circumstances of the case there is no reasonable suspicion to the satisfaction of the commission the applicant used the substance for the purpose of enhancing his or her athletic performance.
- (j) If the athlete intends to compete further in any event or competition that may subject the athlete to drug testing by the commission, the athlete must apply for a separate TUE for any prohibited substance in advance of such event or competition in accordance with the provisions of this section.

RE: 4 CCR Section 424 Therapeutic Use Exemption

Dear Chairman Frierson:

The Department of Consumer Affairs (Department) has great concerns regarding the California State Athletic Commission's (Commission) proposed regulations for the establishment of a Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE) process. I would like to commend the Commission's thoughtful efforts to craft a fully realized regulatory process, however, serious procedural and policy concerns remain and I urge the Commission to withdraw this proposal and cease moving forward with the establishment of TUEs in California.

Despite the Commission's best efforts, the proposed regulation still lacks completeness in both transparency and specificity. For example, the regulation is silent on the physical review of the TUE application, a process that must be as transparent as can be made possible. As written, members of the public and licensees are not provided clarity as to whether the application is reviewed by the Medical Advisory Committee, the full Commission, the Executive Officer, or some combination thereof. The proposal also does not specify if the application, and the review of it, would be made public or kept confidential. Additionally, there is language that indicates retroactive exemptions could be made possible, and this is simply unacceptable given the gravity and history of this subject.

More importantly, the need for this regulation proposal has yet to be justified. This is particularly true provided that existing law already grants the strongest protection for our licensees by prohibiting the use of forbidden substances banned by the World Anti-Doping Agency. This regulation exposes licensees of the Commission to unnecessary risks that goes above and beyond those inherent in their chosen profession. The risk that is taken by allowing licensees of the Commission to use, among other substances, synthetic testosterone, is extraordinary. This raises numerous concerns, not the least of which is that the opponent of any fighter with an exemption for a steroid could be at a dangerous disadvantage to someone who has been training, and is performing, with the help of that substance.

Fighter safety would be jeopardized in more ways than it would be protected, which is why states like Nevada have placed outright bans on TUE's, and the Association of Ringside Physicians, "supports the general elimination of therapeutic use exemptions for testosterone replacement therapy." By following Nevada's example of not allowing any exemptions, and preserving the restrictions in existing law, the Commission will send the strongest message possible which is that our athletes will continue to compete on an even playing field and in a manner that will not jeopardize their health and safety. Ultimately, this demonstrates the Commission's commitment to upholding its mission statement by ensuring the health, safety and welfare of the participants in regulated competitive sporting events in California.

For these reasons I reiterate my encouragement that the Commission not move forward with the adoption of proposed section 424. Thank you for the opportunity to comment on your proposed rulemaking. 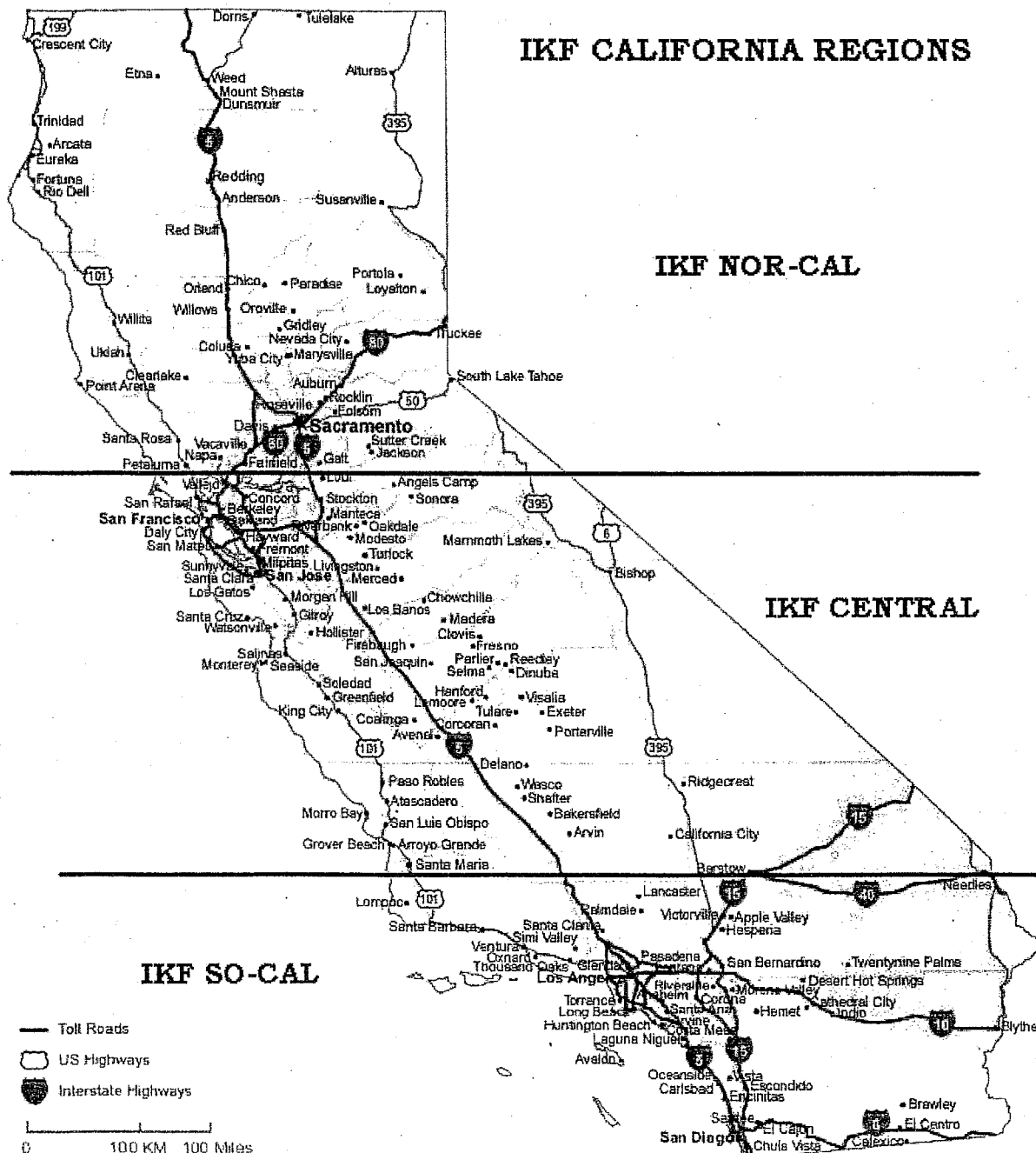

Rules change on Olympic marijuana testing

It's been 15 years since Ross Rebagliati won snowboarding's first Olympic gold medal at the 1998 Winter Games — and then nearly lost that medal after he tested positive for marijuana.

Since then, the drug has become an integral part of Rebagliati's life. Next month Rebagliati will open a medicinal marijuana dispensary in Whistler, British Columbia, called "Ross' Gold." The Canadian has also become a public face for pot-smoking athletes around the globe.

"Anytime somebody gets in trouble for weed I'm the guy the media calls," Rebagliati, who lives outside Whistler, told USA TODAY Sports. "I went on NBC to defend (Michael) Phelps for smoking responsibly. I told them, Hey, it's zero calories, zero fat!"

Now 42, Rebagliati believes that changing attitudes toward marijuana — it's now legal for medicinal purposes in Canada and 14 U.S. states — justifies the drug's removal from the World Anti-Doping Agency's list of banned substances.

Like cocaine and heroin, cannabis is banned during competition by WADA, which oversees drug testing worldwide in Olympic sports.

WADA recently amended its rules on cannabis, raising the threshold for a positive test from 15 nanograms per milliliter to 150 ng/ml. In 1998 at the Nagano Games, Rebagliati recorded a level of 17.8 ng/ml, and argued the test resulted from second-hand smoke, which he still says. Ben Nichols, a spokesperson for WADA, said the raising of the threshold is meant to catch only athletes who smoke during the period of a competition. The drug isn't prohibited out of competition.

"Our information suggests that many cases do not involve game or event-day consumption," Nichols said. "The new threshold level is an attempt to ensure that in-competition use is detected and not use during the days and weeks before competition."

Raising the threshold level to 150 nanograms per milliliter means that an athlete would have to be a "pretty dedicated cannabis consumer" to test positive, according to Allen St. Pierre, executive director of the National Organization for the Reform of Marijuana Laws (NORML).

Last year four athletes in the U.S. Anti-Doping Agency's pool tested positive for tetrahydrocannabinol or THC, the primary ingredient in marijuana. That's a small percentage of the 2,776 in-competition tests the agency conducted. But one of the athletes, wrestler Stephany Lee, was kept off the Olympic team after testing positive at the Olympic trials.

USOC chief communications officer Patrick Sandusky declined to be interviewed for the story but released a statement that said the USOC is committed to clean competition. "Additionally, we respect WADA's decision-making expertise and processes — they decide what is banned and what thresholds to apply and we work to ensure that U.S. athletes are appropriately educated," the statement read.

Although marijuana isn't viewed to have obvious performance-enhancing qualities, one of the reasons it's on WADA's list in the first place is because of the drug's possible effect during competition. For example, you wouldn't want a bobsledder driving down an icy track while impaired, said Dr. Matt Fedoruk, USADA's science director. He adds that the the definition of performance enhancing drugs shouldn't be limited to "making you stronger and faster and being able to jump higher. It's how it affects some of the other parameters that are really important like pain or confidence or some of the things that are a bit more difficult to measure or define analytically."

Athletes sanctioned by the USADA for marijuana generally receive suspensions ranging from three months to a year, depending on the athlete's case and if there was a past violation and whether the drug was coupled with other banned substances. A three-month suspension can be deferred if an athlete completes an education program.

The International Olympic Committee originally banned drugs like marijuana and cocaine because of their illegality, and because they violate the "spirit of sport." WADA, created in 1999, follows three criteria in establishing its list of banned substances: performance enhancement, danger to an athlete's health and violation of the spirit of sport.

Society's attitudes toward marijuana may have contributed to the timing of WADA's change, St. Pierre said. He points to Colorado and Washington passing legislation last year to legalize the drug for recreational use.

"So they kind of ask the question ... if we really don't believe overtly that this is causing people to game the system by developing greater athletic skills, shouldn't we really revisit this," St. Pierre said.

"It's kind of hard to imagine that cannabis should be thrown into that mixture (of banned drugs) unless it is still viewed as a moral turpitude," he added. "Society doesn't seem to view it anymore as a moral turpitude."

Attitudes toward the drug vary around the world. "It's a global prohibited list," Fedoruk said. "One country doesn't have the last word per se on inclusion of substances. Globally there's been some pressure from various stakeholders to address what is the appropriate threshold that you would catch use in competition only of cannabis. I think the change was to try to reflect that more accurately."

St. Pierre also raised the issue of the anti-inflammatory qualities associated with cannabinoids and whether they could provide some athletes an unfair advantage. Athletes such as former Dallas Cowboys center Mark Stepnoski have said that the drug has helped in recovery after strenuous training. St. Pierre says there's more scientific research being done that supports those claims.

In the sports that fall under WADA jurisdiction, pot use still accounts for a significant number of violations. According to USADA statistics, of the 147 sanctions since 2008, 28 were from cannabis. Dr. Don Catlin, founder of the UCLA Olympic Analytic Laboratory, said cannabis violations account for a larger number internationally.

In 2003, cannabinoids accounted for 13.9% (378 of 2,716) of all adverse analytical findings (samples that found the presence of a banned substance or method), according to WADA statistics. Only anabolic agents such as testosterone and stimulants surpassed cannabinoids as banned substances found in testing. In 2011, WADA reported 445 violations for cannabis or 7.9% of 5,600 adverse test results.

One of the founders of modern day drug testing, Catlin said there was a long-running debate about marijuana during the early years of testing for banned substances.

"Some people felt it wasn't correct to use a PED test to try and clean up the image of sport," Catlin said. "In the end the IOC decided you should test for those kinds of drugs."

Positive marijuana tests can have a serious impact on athletes' lives. Last summer American judo athlete Nick Delpopolo was sent home from the London Olympics after testing positive. Delpopolo, who said the test was a result of eating baked goods laced with marijuana, declined comment for this story.

Lee, the wrestler, was banned for one year for her positive test last summer. It was her second doping violation. In a radio interview after her second positive, Lee said she used marijuana for medicinal purposes, but said she had stopped smoking two weeks before competition.

"It's hard," Lee said. "I'm home watching the opening ceremonies on TV."

In 2003, a positive test for cannabis drove downhill mountain biker Gary Houseman out of his sport entirely. A BMX prodigy, Houseman became the first American in four years to win a stop on the UCI World Cup when he won in Grouse Mountain, British Columbia. But when he tested positive for marijuana — and faced a \$2000 fine and a year suspension — Houseman retired at age 23.

"I just decided to move on," Houseman said.

While he can't speak for WADA's reasoning for the change, Fedoruk says he thinks the goal is to focus on more "potent ergogenic drugs such as EPO, human growth hormone and testosterone.

"Enhancing our capabilities in doing our job better to being able to detect those is always a goal of the anti-doping movement. To the extent that perhaps resources can be reallocated because countries maybe aren't spending as much on cannabis, I think it's a potentially good thing."

Rebagliati, who retired from snowboard competition in 2000, is open about his feelings on the subject.

"Everybody knew I was a pot smoker after the Olympics," he said. "I said I smoked and I still smoke but I never denied it."
