

OPEN SESSION

Agenda Item 1 – Call to Order / Roll Call / Establishment of Quorum

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 a.m. by Chair Peter Villegas. Executive Officer (EO) Andy Foster called roll; Commissioner Hendrickson was absent. Quorum was established.

Agenda Item 2 - Chairman's Opening Remarks

Chair Villegas welcomed everyone to the first Commission meeting of 2024 and acknowledged the enthusiasm and passion of his fellow commissioners for the work they do with the Athletic Commission.

<u>Agenda Item 3- Review and Possible action to approve the December 9, 2023, Commission Meeting Minutes.</u>

Chair Villegas presented the December 9, 2023, Commission meeting minutes for approval.

Commissioner Gruwell moved to approve the meeting minutes.

Commissioner Dr. De Mars seconded the motion.

No Commission or public comments

The motion passed 5-0 by roll call vote. Vice Chair Dr. Williams Abstained.

<u>Agenda Item 4- Election of Officers Pursuant to the Requirements of the Business</u> and Professions Code 18606

Legal Counsel Mr. Swenson opened for nominations for Chair. Commissioner Wetch praised the work the Commission has been doing and nominated Chair Villegas. Chair Villegas accepted the nomination. There were no other nominations. There were no Commission or public comments.

The implied motion is to elect Chair Villegas as Chair of the Commission.

The motion passed 5-0 by roll call vote. Chair Villegas abstained.

Legal Counsel Mr. Swenson opened for nominations for Vice Chair. Chair Villegas nominated Vice Chair Dr. Williams due to his medical expertise and passion for the Commission and combat sports. Vice Chair Dr. Williams accepted the nomination. There were no further nominations. There were no Commission or public comments.

The implied motion is to elect Vice Chair Dr. Williams as Vice Chair of the Commission.

The motion passed 5-0 by roll call vote. Vice Chair Williams abstained.

Agenda Item 5- Discussion and Possible Action regarding Team Combat League's Request for a temporary Promoter license in order to Hold an Event using Team Combat League Rules pursuant California Code of Regulations, title 4, section 533.

EO Foster explained that Team Combat League held two events last year using Thompson Boxing's promoter license with approval of the Commission. He explained that the promoter has changed ownership and is seeking a promoter license. The request event is for March 28th, but EO Foster explained that the Commission would not have the staffing available for that weekend as it already busy. EO Foster and Chair Villegas explained that the prior events held were time consuming which required the staff and officials to work long hours. Chair Villegas asked if the Commission would be able to limit the length of the event. EO Foster said he would be able to limit the number of bouts.

Commissioner Gruwell **moved** to approve Team Combat League for a temporary promoter license to hold an event.

Commissioner Wetch seconded the motion.

No Commission or public comments.

Motion passed 6-0 by roll call vote.

<u>Agenda Item 6 – Discussion and Possible Action regarding Approving the Request</u> for a Boxers Pension Distribution from retired boxer Paul Banke.

Mr. Swenson explained that pursuant to Rule 408 of the boxing rules of the CCR 4.408.b empowers the Commission to determine all questions arising in connection with the administration, interpretation, and application of the Boxer's Pension Plan and gives the Commission all power necessary or appropriate to accomplish the duties under the Plan.

EO Foster explained that Paul Banke was a boxer who was a part of the original pension plan and when the plan was switched over to the current plan his funds were not transferred for some reason. After the LA Times article was released, Mr. Banke applied for the pension. EO Foster stated that the Commission was not able to locate Mr. Banke's complete records but believes he does qualify for the pension. The question is how much Mr. Banke is entitled to. EO Foster's stated that the options to pay Mr. Banke were to pay him the average payout from the last 3 years (~\$21,000), or since he would have vested in 2014, they could take and pay the average of 2014-2016 (~\$18,000). Commissioner Dr. De Mars agrees that given that the Commission knows Mr. Banke qualifies for the pension plan, but cannot determine exactly how much money he has that paying out the average is a good idea, and paying the higher amount would be the best option.

Commissioner Dr. De Mars **motioned** to approve the application for benefits and fix the amount of benefit at \$21,017.89 (the average of the 3 prior years).

Commissioner Fiore **seconded** the motion.

No Commission or public comments

The motion passed 6-0.

Agenda Item 7 – Review, Discussion and Possible Action Approving Proposed Changes to Previously Approved Text Amending Section 299, of Article 6, of Division 2, of Title 4 of The California Code of Regulations – Dehydration and Rehydration.

EO Foster explained he is bringing the dehydration regulations back to the Commission to review. He explained that if the Commission were to cancel bouts where fighters gained back 15% of their body weight, it would decimate events. EO Foster brought up a list of fights where fighters gained back 15% and pointed out some of the more well known and bigger bouts that would have been canceled under the proposed regulation. EO Foster explained that one of his ideas is to instead fine fighters 20% of their purse and give it to the opponent.

Commissioner Wetch asked what we would do with the fines if both fighters were over 15%. EO Foster explained that perhaps the fines could go to the Commission. Commissioner Dr. De Mars thinks the fine is a good idea because the opponent would be going into the fight at a disadvantage. She stated she had an issue with the proposed wording about requiring fighters to move up in weight class due to its nebulous wording. Commissioner Wetch asked if the opponent of the fighter that gained over 15% would still be required to fight. EO Foster explained that when there is a large discrepancy between the fighters the inspectors will speak out the opponent and ask if they would like to continue with the fight and if they do not, they still receive their purse. EO Foster stated it may be possible to add something to the bout agreements regarding the consequences and fines of gaining back too much weight. Vice Chair Dr. Williams noted that 15% weight gain was the amount the doctors agreed was a significant amount of weight for the fighters to be gaining back. EO Foster stated he will take all the Commissioners" comments and work on revising the proposed regulation and present an update at an upcoming meeting.

Stephen Fong with the Office of Administrative Law noted that the Commission will need to clarify any "may" statements in the proposed regulations and that it would be best to withdraw the previous approval and direct Commission staff to return with new language at another meeting. Mr. Swenson noted that fighters that come in underweight at the weighin should probably not be penalized the same as the fighters that gain back 15% and the Commission should address that in the new language.

Commissioner Gruwell **motioned** to rescind the prior proposed text from the March 2023 Commission meeting and direct Commission staff to return with new language at another Commission meeting.

Commissioner Fiore **seconded** the motion.

Joe Stevenson spoke about his experience with weight cutting.

The motion passed 6-0.

Agenda Item 8 - Executive Officer's Report

a. Budget Update for the Support Fund, the Neurological Fund, and Pension Program:

EO Foster informed the Commissioners that, to date, the Commission has deposited \$1,551,000 into the support fund. EO Foster met with the Budget Office prior to the meeting, and they explained that the Commission will expend between \$2.1 and 2.3 million this fiscal year. EO Foster stated the Commission was able to collect the max fees from the UFC event. He also explained that the Commission has been receiving more revenue from wrestling events than had been initially anticipated. EO Foster explained that the upcoming events should help with the revenue and may allow the Commission to at least break even if not become revenue positive. He did note that TGB has not submitted a request to hold an event for this year yet. EO Foster noted that the neurological fund has been collecting additional revenue thanks to the regulation Vice Chair Dr. Williams helped with. EO Foster stated that the Commission has begun collecting and reporting for the MMA Benefit Fund and as of February 28th \$15,722.71 has been deposited into it.

b. Update on the Proposed Changes to Unified Rules of MMA:

EO Foster explained that he is the Chair for the ABC's Rules Subcommittee and is spearheading two changes to the Unified Rules of MMA. EO Foster explained that he and Commissioner Wetch were at an event in Sacramento where a fighter was picked up and slammed directly on their head (spiked). EO Foster said what they saw concerned them and he felt that it should not be a legal move. Commissioner Wetch explained that referee Herb Dean came to them after the bout and explained the need to change the rules to prevent that move. EO Foster stated that they are still beginning to discuss how to change the rules to address spiking.

a. Kneeing and/or Kicking the head of a grounded opponent: EO Foster explained that the current rule says if the fighter's hand is down, they cannot be kneed in the head. However, fighters have been putting their hand down and picking it back up over and over again. He stated that oftentimes the opponent cannot tell if their hand is down. EO Foster's solution is to require something other than the hand (e.g., knee, elbow) to be touching the mat to be considered grounded. EO Foster presented video examples to the Commissioners. EO Foster

explained that he would suggest that the ABC vote on the suggested rule changes to allow for at least 6 to 8 months prior to taking effect so that fighters have time to learn about the rule change. He also suggested that the vote should happen before the officials training in July, so the referees are able to teach the new rules at the upcoming ABC Conference.

b. Downward pointing elbow strike (12 to 6): EO Foster explained that the 12-6 rule is antiquated and makes no sense since fighters still have the ability to do an 11-5 or a 9-3 elbow. He presented a video example. EO Foster explained that removing this foul would help referees with officiating bouts consistently.

c. Report on Pending and Proposed Regulations:

Mr. Fong reiterated the decision from agenda item 7. He also noted that the pension package will be addressed after the Sunset Review.

d. Status Update of Delegated Entities

- California Amateur Mixed Martial Arts Organizations (CAMO)- J.T Steele: The quarterly report from CAMO was submitted by Mr. Steele and can be found in the meeting materials. Mr. Steele explained CAMO is still working on getting their online assignment platform up and running.
- USA Boxing (USA Boxing)- Andrew Banuet: The quarterly report from USA Boxing was submitted by Mike McAtee and can be found in the meeting materials. Mr. Banuet thanked Lee Palmer and Rogelio Chapa for their help with preventing unsanctioned events that were reported. Mr. Banuet also noted that Jajaira Gonzalez from Glendora, CA has qualified for the 2024 Olympics in Paris.
- United States Fight League (USFL)-Joe Stevenson: The quarterly report from the USFL was submitted by Joe Stevenson and can be found in the meeting materials. Mr. Stevenson stated that the USFL has been having great success with the character development program with the Cedar Sinai Kerlan-Jobe Institute and will be adding the number to the suicide hotline to their website.
- International Kickboxing Federation (IKF)- Toni Fossum: The quarterly report from IKF was submitted by Ms. Fossum and can be found in the meeting materials. Ms. Fossum shared that the appetite for Muay Thai/Kickboxing has been increasing in California.

e. Staffing update:

EO Foster explained that the Commission has been continuing their work with Monica and Peter at the Public Affairs office. Monica has been helping with getting the specialized license plate paperwork completed and submitted. Christine Lally has helped the Commission get new athletic inspectors hired. The Commission office is still running with historic low staffing levels, but EO Foster stated he is not yet comfortable enough to hire new office staff. The commission now has 67 inspectors

and 171 officials. EO Foster noted that Mike North, one of the Commission's best timekeepers, will be retiring after 25 years.

f. Upcoming Event Schedule:


Mr. Foster went over upcoming events that the Commissioners may want to attend.

BACKGROUND

The maximum approved meal per diem allowed by the state is 13 dollars for breakfast, 15 dollars for lunch, 26 dollars for dinner and 5 dollars in incidentals for every 24 hours of travel, this totals out to be 59 dollars. The current meal per diem rate for Officials is 46 dollars.

The approved mileage rate by the state is .67 cents per mile, Officials are currently being paid .625 cents per mile.

With the approval of Bare-Knuckle Fighting Championship (BKFC), an officials pay scale for BKFC events has been added to the proposed Officials' Pay Scale.

The proposed changes to the Officials' Pay Scale are in red on the draft which is included in the meeting materials.

RECOMMENDATION

I am recommending changing the allowed meal per diem and mileage pay rate to align with the allowance set forth by CalHR and for the Commission to incorporate any meal per diem and mileage pay rate changes made by CalHR. I am also recommending for the Commission to approve the proposed officials pay for Bare-Knuckle Fighting Championship (BKFC) events.

RE: SUSPENSION, FINE AND REVOCATION-CHARGE LETTER

Dear Mr. Hunt:

On April 27, 2024, you competed in a bout against Michael Terrill at BKFC: Knucklemania IV at the Peacock Theater, Los Angeles, California. The results of your urine sample you provided came back positive for the following prohibited substances: Trenbolone and an elevated testosterone/epitestosterone ratio of 172.

Pursuant to California Business and Professions Code section 18842, your professional mixed martials arts license is suspended retroactive to the day of the event, April 27, 2024. 
Upon the dissolution or winding up of this corporation, its assets remaining after payment, or provision for payment, of all debts and liabilities of this corporation shall be distributed to a nonprofit fund, foundation or corporation which is organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational and/or religious purposes and which has established its tax-exempt status under Internal Revenue Code section 501(c)(3).

Notwithstanding any of the above statements of purpose and powers, this corporation shall not, except to an insubstantial degree, engage in any activities or exercise any powers that are not in furtherance of the specific purpose of this corporation.

NON-PROFIT BYLAWS OF ISKA CALIFORNIA

PREAMBLE

The following Bylaws shall be subject to, and governed by, the Non-Profit Corporation Act of California and the Articles of Incorporation of ISKA CALIFORNIA In the event of a direct conflict between the herein contained provisions of these Bylaws and the mandatory provisions of the Non-Profit Corporation Act of California, said Non-Profit Corporation Act shall be the prevailing controlling law. In the event of a direct conflict between the provisions of these Bylaws and the Articles of Incorporation of Corporation/Organization, it shall then be these Bylaws which shall be controlling.

ARTICLE 1 - NAME

The legal name of the Non-Profit Corporation/Organization shall be known as ISKA CALIFORNIA, and shall herein be referred to as the "Corporation/Organization."

ARTICLE 2 - PURPOSE

The general purposes for which this Corporation/Organization has been established are as follows:

The purpose for which the Non-Profit Corporation is formed is set forth in the attached Articles of Incorporation

The Corporation/Organization is established within the meaning of IRS Publication 557 Section 501(c)(3) Organization of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code") or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code and shall be operated exclusively for sanctioning and regulation of combat sports events

In addition, this Corporation/Organization has been formed for the purpose of perfonning all things incidental to, or appropriate in, the foregoing specific and primary purposes. However, the Corporation/Organization shall not, except to an insubstantial degree, engage in any activity or the exercise of any powers which are not in furtherance of its primary non-profit purposes.

The Corporation/Organization shall hold and may exercise all such powers as may be conferred upon any nonprofit organization by the laws of the State of California and as may be necessary or expedient for the administration of the affairs and attainment of the purposes of the Corporation/Organization. At no time and in no event shall the Corporation/Organization participate in any activities which have not been permitted to be carried out by a Corporation/Organization exempt under Section 501(c) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (the "Code").

ARTICLE 3 - OFFICES

The principal office of the Corporation/Organization shall be located at 5425 Nectar Cir, Elk Grove, California 95757.

The Corporation/Organization may have other such offices as the Board of Directors may determine or deem necessary, or as the affairs of the Corporation/Organization may find a need for from time to time.

ARTICLE 4 - DEDICATION OF ASSETS

The properties and assets of the Corporation/Organization are irrevocably dedicated to and for non-profit purposes only. No part of the net earnings, properties, or assets of this Corporation/Organization, on dissolution or otherwise, shall inure to the benefit of any person or any member, director, or officer of this Corporation/Organization. On liquidation or dissolution, all remaining properties and assets of the Corporation/Organization shall be distributed and paid over to an organization dedicated to non-profit purposes which has established its tax-exempt status pursuant to Section 501(c) of the Code.

ARTICLE 5 - BOARD OF DIRECTORS

General Powers and R8SJJOnsibilities

The Corporation/Organization shall be governed by a Board of Directors (the "Board"), which shall have all the rights, powers, privileges and limitations of liability of directors of a non-profit corporation organized under the Non-Profit Corporation Act of California. The Board shall establish policies and directives governing business and programs of the Corporation/Organization

and shall delegate to the Executive Director and Corporation/Organization staff, subject to the provisions of these Bylaws, authority and responsibility to see that the policies and directives are appropriately followed.

Number and Qualifications

The Board shall have up to 3, but no fewer than 3, Board members. The number of Board members may be increased beyond 3 members or decreased to less than 3 members by the affirmative vote of a simple majority of the then serving Board of Directors. A Board member need not be a resident of the State of california.

In addition to the regular membership of the Board, representative of such other organizations or individuals as the Board may deem advisable to elect shall be *Ex-Officio Board Members*, which will have the same rights and obligations, including voting power, as the other directors.

Board Compensation

The Board shall receive no compensation other than for reasonable expenses. However, provided the compensation structure complies with Sections relating to "Contracts Involving Board Members and/or Officers" as stipulated under these Bylaws, nothing in these Bylaws shall be construed to preclude any Board member from serving the Corporation/Organization in any other capacity and receiving compensation for services rendered.

Board Elections

The Governance Committee shall present nomination for new and renewing Board members at the board meeting immediately preceding the beginning of the next fiscal year:. Recommendations from the Governance Committee shall be made known to the Board in writing before nominations are made and voted on. New and renewing Board members shall be approved by a two-thirds majority of those Board members at a Board meeting at which a quorum is present.

Term of Board

All appointments to the Board shall be for a term of 2 year(s). No person shall serve more than 10 consecutive terms unless a majority of the Board, during the course of a Board meeting at which a quorum is present, votes to appoint a Board member to 20 additional year(s). No person shall serve more than 20 consecutive years. After serving the maximum total number of consecutive years on the Board, a member may be eligible for reconsideration as a Board member after 1 years have passed since the conclusion of such Board member's service.

vacancies

A vacancy on the Board of Directors may exist at the occurrence of the following conditions:

- a) The death, resignation, or removal of any director;
- b) The declaration by resolution of the Board of a vacancy in the office of a director who has been declared of unsound mind by a final order of court, convicted of a felony, found by final order or judgment of any court to have breached a duty pursuant to the Corporation Code and/or Act of the law dealing with the standards of conduct for a director, or has missed 3 consecutive meetings of the Board of Directors, or a total of 4 meetings of the Board during any one calendar year;
- c) An increase in the authorized number of directors; or
- d) The failure of the directors, at any annual or other meeting of directors at which director(s) are to be elected, to elect the full authorized number of directors.

The Board of Directors, by way of affirmative vote of a majority of the directors then currently in office, may remove any director without cause at any regular or special meeting, provided that the director to be removed has been notified in writing in the manner set forth in Article 5 - Meetings that such action would be considered at the meeting.

Except as provided in this paragraph, any director may resign effective upon giving written notice to the chair of the Board, the president of Corporation/Organization, the secretary of Corporation/Organization, or the Board of Directors, unless the notice specifies a later time for the effectiveness of the resignation. If the resignation is effective at a future time, a successor may be designated to take office when the resignation becomes effective. Unless the Attorney General of california is first notified, no director may resign when the Corporation/Organization would then be left without a duly elected director in charge of its affairs.

Any vacancy on the Board may be filled by vote of a two-thirds majority of the directors then in office, whether or not the number of directors then in office is less than a quorum, or by vote of a sole remaining director. No reduction of the authorized number of directors shall have the effect of removing any director before that director's term of office expires.

A Board member elected to fill a vacancy shall be elected for the unexpired term of his or her predecessor in office.

Resignation

Each Board member shall have the right to resign at any time upon written notice thereof to the Chair of the Board, Secretary of the Board, or the Executive Director. Unless otherwise specified in the notice, the resignation shall take effect upon receipt thereof, and the acceptance of such resignation shall take effect upon receipt thereof, and the acceptance of such resignation shall not be necessary to make it effective.

Removal

A Board member may be removed, with or without cause, at any duly constituted meeting of the Board, by the affirmative vote of a two-thirds majority of then-serving Board members.

Meetinas

The Board's regular meetings may be held at such time and place as shall be determined by the Board. The Chair of the Board or any 2 regular Board members may call a special meeting of the Board with 5 days' written notice provided to each member of the Board. The notice shall be served upon each Board member via hand delivery, regular mail, email, or fax. The person(s) authorized to call such special meetings of the Board may also establish the place the meeting is to be conducted, so long as it is a reasonable place to hold any special meeting of the Board.

Minutes

The Secretary shall be responsible for the recording of all minutes of each and every meeting of the Board in which business shall be transacted in such order as the Board may determine from time to time. However, in the event that the Secretary is unavailable, the Chair of the Board shall appoint an individual to act as Secretary at the meeting. The Secretary, or the individual appointed to act as Secretary, shall prepare the minutes of the meetings, which shall be delivered to the Corporation/Organization to be placed in the minute books. A copy of the minutes shall be delivered to each Board member via either regular mail, hand delivered, emailed, or faxed within 10 business days after the close of each Board meeting.

Action by Written Consent

Any action required by law to be taken at a meeting of the Board, or any action that may be taken at a meeting of the Board, may be taken without a meeting if consent in writing setting forth the action so taken shall be signed by all Board members. The number of directors in office must constitute a quorum for an action taken by unanimous written consent. Such consent shall be placed in the minute book of the Corporation/Organization and shall have the same force and effect as a unanimous vote of the Board taken at an actual meeting. The Board members' written consent may be executed in multiple counterparts or copies, each of which shall be deemed an original for all purposes. In addition, facsimile signatures and electronic signatures or other electronic "consent click" acknowledgments shall be effective as original signatures.

Quorum

At each meeting of the Board of Directors or Board Committees, the presence of 2 persons shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. If at any time the Board consists of an even number of members and a vote results in a tie, then the vote of the Chair of the Board shall be the deciding vote. The act of the majority of the Board members serving on the Board or Board Committees and present at a meeting in which there is a quorum shall be the act of the Board or Board Committees, unless otherwise provided by the Articles of Incorporation, these Bylaws, or a law specifically requiring otherwise. If a quorum is not present at a meeting, the Board members present may adjourn the meeting from time to time without further notice until a quorum shall be present. However, a Board member shall be considered present at any meeting of the Board or Board Committees if during the meeting he or she is present via telephone or web conferencing with the other Board members participating in the meeting.

Voting

Each Board member shall only have one vote.

Proxy

Board members shall not be allowed to vote by written proxy

Board Member Attendance

An elected Board Member who is absent from 3 consecutive regular meetings of the Board during a fiscal year shall be encouraged to reevaluate with the Chair of the Board his/her commitment to the Corporation/Organization. The Board may deem a Board member who has missed 3 consecutive meetings without such a reevaluation with the Chair to have resigned from the Board.

ARTICLE 6 - OFFICERS

Officers and Duties

The Board shall elect officers of the Corporation/Organization which shall include aChair of the Board (Chief Executive Officer), President (Executive Director), a Secretaiy, a Treasurer (Chief Financial Officer), and such other officers as the Board may designate by resolution. The same person may hold any number of offices, except that neither the Secretaiy nor the Treasurer may serve concurrently as the Chair of the Board or the President. In addition to the duties in accordance with this Article, officers shall conduct all other duties typically pertaining to their offices and other such duties which may be required by law, Articles of Incorporation, or by these bylaws, subject to control of the Board of Directors, and they shall perform any other such additional duties which the Board of Directors may assign to them at their discretion.

The officers will be selected by the Board at its annual meeting, and shall serve the needs of the Board, subject to all the rights, if any, of any officer who may be under a contract of employment. Therefore, without any bias or predisposition to the rights of any officer that may be under any contract of employment, any officer may be removed with or without cause by the Board. All officers have the right to resign at any time by providing notice in writing to the Chair of the Board, President, and/or Secretaily of the Corporation/Organization, without bias or predisposition to all rights, if any, of the Corporation/Organization under any contract to which said officer is a part thereof. All resignations shall become effective upon the date on which the written notice of resignation is received or at any time later as may be specified within the resignation; and unless otherwise indicated within the written notice, a stated acceptance of the resignation shall not be required to make the resignation effective.

Any and all vacancies in any office because of death, resignation, disqualification, removal, or for any other cause, shall be filled in accordance to the herein prescribed bylaws for regular appointments to such office. The compensation, if any, of the officers shall be fixed or determined by resolution of the Board of Directors.

Chair of the Board (Chief Executive Officer)

It shall be the responsibility of the Chair of the Board, when present, to preside over all meetings of the Board of Directors and Executive Committee. The Chair of the Board is authorized to execute, in the name of the Corporation/Organization, any and all contracts or other documents which may be authorized, either generally or specifically, by the Board to be executed by the Corporation/Organization, except when required by law that the President's signature must be provided.

President (Executive Director>

It shall be the responsibility of the President, in general, to supervise and conduct all activities and operations of the Corporation/Organization, subject to the control, advice and consent of the Board of Directors. The President shall keep the Board of Directors completely informed, shall freely consult with them in relation to all activities of the Corporation/Organization, and shall see that all orders and/or resolutions of the Board are carried out to the effect intended. The Board of Directors may place the President under a contract of employment where appropriate. The President shall be empowered to act, speak for, or otherwise represent the Corporation/Organization between meetings of the Board. The President shall be responsible for the hiring and firing of all personnel, and shall be responsible for keeping the Board informed at all times of staff performance and for implementing any personnel policies which may be adopted and implemented by the Board. The President, at all times, is authorized to contract, receive, deposit, disburse and account for all funds of the Corporation/Organization, to execute in the name of the Corporation/Organization all contracts and other documents authorized either generally or specifically by the Board to be executed by the Corporation/Organization, and to negotiate any and all material business transactions of the Corporation/Organization.

Secretary

The Secretaiy, or his/her designee, shall be the custodian of all records and documents of the Corporation/Organization, which are required to be kept at the principal office of the Corporation/Organization, and shall act as secretaiy at all meetings of the Board of Directors, and shall keep the minutes of all such meetings on file in hard copy or electronic format. S/he shall attend to the giving and serving of all notices of the Corporation/Organization and shall see that the seal of the Corporation/Organization, if any, is affixed to all documents, the execution of which on behalf of the Corporation/Organization under its seal is duly authorized in accordance with the provisions of these bylaws.

Treasurer (Chief Financial Officer)

It shall be the responsibility of the Treasurer to keep and maintain, or cause to be kept and maintained, adequate and accurate accounts of all the properties and business transactions of the Corporation/Organization, including accounts of its assets, liabilities, receipts, disbursements, gains, losses, capital, retained earnings, and other matters customarily included in financial statements.

The Treasurer shall be responsible for ensuring the deposit of, or cause to be deposited, all money and other valuables as may be designated by the Board of Directors. Furthermore, the Treasurer shall disburse, or cause to be disbursed, the funds of the Corporation/Organization, as may be ordered by the Board of Directors, and shall render to the Chair of the Board, President, and directors, whenever they request it, an account of all the Treasurer's transactions as treasurer and of the

financial condition of the Corporation/Organization.

The Treasurer shall give the Corporation/Organization a bond, if so requested and required by the Board of Directors, in the amount and with the surety or sureties specified by the Board for faithful performance of the duties of the Treasurer's office and for restoration to the Corporation/Organization of all its books, papers, vouchers, money and other property of every kind in the Treasurer's possession or under the Treasurer's control upon the Treasurer's death, resignation, retirement, or removal from office. The Corporation/Organization shall pay the cost of such a bond.

ARTICLE 7 - COMMITTEES

Committees of Directors

The Board of Directors may, by resolution adopted by a majority of the directors then in office, provided that a quorum is present, designate one or more committees to exercise all or a portion of the authority of the Board, to the extent of the powers specifically delegated in the resolution of the Board or in these bylaws. Each such committee shall consist of two (2) or more directors, and may also include persons who are not on the Board but whom the directors believe to be reliable and competent to serve at the specific committee. However, committees exercising any authority of the Board of Directors may not have any non-director members. The Board may designate one or more alternative members of any committee who may replace any absent member at any meeting of the committee. The appointment of members or alternate members of a committee requires the vote of a majority of the directors then in office, provided that a quorum is present. The Board of Directors may also designate one or more advisory committees that do not have the authority of the Board. However, no committee, regardless of Board resolution, may:

- a) Approve of any action that, pursuant to applicable Law, would also require the affirmative vote of the members of the Board if this were a membership vote.
- b) Fill vacancies on, or remove the members of, the Board of Directors or any committee that has the authority of the Board.
- c) Fix compensation of the directors serving on the Board or on any committee.
- d) Amend or repeal the Articles of Incorporation or bylaws or adopt new bylaws.
- e) Amend or repeal any resolution of the Board of Directors that by its express terms is not so amendable or repealable.
- f) Appoint any other committees of the Board of Directors or their members.
- g) Approve a plan of merger, consolidation, voluntary dissolution, bankruptcy, or reorganization; or a plan for the sale, lease, or exchange of all or considerably all of the property and assets of the Corporation/Organization otherwise than in the usual and regular course of its business; or revoke any such plan.
- h) Approve any self-dealing transaction, except as provided pursuant to law.

Unless otherwise authorized by the Board of Directors, no committee shall compel the Corporation/Organization in a contract or agreement or expend Corporation/Organization funds.

Meetings and Actions of Committees

Meetings and actions of all committees shall be governed by, and held and taken in accordance with, the provisions of Article 5 - Board of Directors of these bylaws concerning meetings and actions of the directors, with such changes in the context of those bylaws as are necessary to substitute the committee and its members for the Board of Directors and its members, except that the time for regular meetings of committees may be determined either by resolution of the Board of Directors or by resolution of the committee. Special meetings of committees may also be called by resolution of the Board of Directors. Notice of special meetings of committees shall also be given to any and all alternate members, who shall have the right to attend all meetings of the committee. Minutes shall be kept of each meeting of any committee and shall be filed with the Corporation/Organization records. The Board of Directors may adopt rules not consistent with the provisions of these bylaws for the governance of any committee.

If a director relies on information prepared by a committee of the Board on which the director does not serve, the committee must be composed exclusively of any or any combination of (a) directors, (b) directors or employees of the Corporation/Organization whom the director believes to be reliable and competent in the matters presented, or (c) counsel, independent accountants, or other persons as to matters which the director believes to be within that person's professional or expert competence.

Executive Committee

Pursuant to Article 7 - Committee of Directors, the Board may appoint an Executive Committee composed of a minimum of 2 directors, one of whom shall be the Chair of the Board of the Board and another shall be either the Secretary, or the Treasurer, to serve on the Executive Committee of the Board. The Executive Committee, unless limited in a resolution of the Board, shall have and may exercise all the authority of the Board in the management of the business and affairs of the Corporation/Organization between meetings of the Board, provided, however, that the Executive Committee shall not have the authority of the Board in reference to those matters enumerated in Article 7 - Committee of Directors. The secretary of the Corporation/Organization shall send to each director a summary report of the business conducted in any meeting of the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE 8 - STANDARD OF CARE

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A director shall perform all the duties of a director, including, but not limited to, duties as a member of any committee of the Board on which the director may serve, in such a manner as the director deems to be i1 the best interest of the Corporation/Organization and with such care, including reasonable inquiry, as an ordinary, prudent, and reasonable person in a similar situation may exercise under similar circumstances.

In the performance of the duties of a director, a director shall be entitled to rely on information, opinions, reports, or statements, including financial statements and other financial data, in each case prepared or presented by:

- a) One or more officers or employees of the Corporation/Organization whom the director deems to be reliable and competent in the matters presented;
- b) Counsel, independent accountants, or other persons, as to the matters which the director deems to be within such person's professional or expert competence; or
- c) A committee of the Board upon which the director does not serve, as to matters within its designated authority, which committee the director deems to merit confidence,

so long as in any such case the director acts in good faith, after reasonable inquiry when the need may be indicated by the circumstances, and without knowledge that would cause such reliance to be unwarranted.

Except as herein provided in Article 8 - Standard of Care, any person who performs the duties of a director in accordance with the above shall have no liability based upon any failure or alleged failure to discharge that person's obligations as a director, including, without limitation of the following, any actions or omissions which exceed or defeat a public or charitable purpose to which the Corporation/Organization, or assets held by it, are dedicated.

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The Corporation/Organization shall not make any loan of money or property to, or guarantee the obligation of, any director or officer, unless approved by the California Attorney General; provided, however, that the Corporation/Organization may advance money to a director or officer of the Corporation/Organization or any subsidiary for expenses reasonably anticipated to be incurred in the performance of the duties of such officer or director so long as such individual would be entitled to be reimbursed for such expenses absent that advance.

Conflict of Interest

The purpose of the Conflict of Interest policy is to protect the Corporation/Organization's interest when it is contemplating entering into a transaction or arrangement that might benefit the private interest of one of its officers or directors, or that might otherwise result in a possible excess benefit transaction. This policy is intended to supplement but not replace any applicable state and federal laws governing conflict of interest applicable to nonprofit and charitable corporations/organizations and is not intended as an exclusive statement of responsibilities.

Restriction on Interested Directors

Not more than 100% (percent) of the persons serving on the Board of Directors at any time may be interested persons. An interested person is (1) any person currently being compensated by the Corporation/Organization for services rendered to it within the previous twelve (12) months, whether as a full-time or part-time employee, independent contractor, or otherwise, excluding any reasonable compensation paid to a director; and (2) any brother, sister, parent, ancestor, descendent, spouse, brother-in-law, sister-in-law, son-in-law, mother-in-law, or father-in-law of any such person. However, any violation of the provisions of this section shall not affect the validity or enforceability of any transaction entered into by the interested person.

Duty to Disclose

In connection with any actual or possible conflict of interest, an interested person must disclose the existence of the financial

financial condition of the Corporation/Organization.

The Treasurer shall give the Corporation/Organization a bond, if so requested and required by the Board of Directors, in the amount and with the surety or sureties specified by the Board for faithful performance of the duties of the Treasurer's office and for restoration to the Corporation/Organization of all its books, papers, vouchers, money and other property of every kind in the Treasurer's possession or under the Treasurer's control upon the Treasurer's death, resignation, retirement, or removal from office. The Corporation/Organization shall pay the cost of such a bond.

ARTICLE 7 - COMMITTEES

Committees of Directors

The Board of Directors may, by resolution adopted by a majority of the directors then in office, provided that a quorum is present, designate one or more committees to exercise all or a portion of the authority of the Board, to the extent of the powers specifically delegated in the resolution of the Board or in these bylaws. Each such committee shall consist of two (2) or more directors, and may also include persons who are not on the Board but whom the directors believe to be reliable and competent to serve at the specific committee. However, committees exercising any authority of the Board of Directors may not have any non-director members. The Board may designate one or more alternative members of any committee who may replace any absent member at any meeting of the committee. The appointment of members or alternate members of a committee requires the vote of a majority of the directors then in office, provided that a quorum is present. The Board of Directors may also designate one or more advisory committees that do not have the authority of the Board. However, no committee, regardless of Board resolution, may:

- a) Approve of any action that, pursuant to applicable Law, would also require the affirmative vote of the members of the Board if this were a membership vote.
- b) Fill vacancies on, or remove the members of, the Board of Directors or any committee that has the authority of the Board.
- c) Fix compensation of the directors serving on the Board or on any committee.
- d) Amend or repeal the Articles of Incorporation or bylaws or adopt new bylaws.
- e) Amend or repeal any resolution of the Board of Directors that by its express terms is not so amendable or repealable.
- f) Appoint any other committees of the Board of Directors or their members.
- g) Approve a plan of merger, consolidation, voluntary dissolution, bankruptcy, or reorganization; or a plan for the sale, lease, or exchange of all or considerably all of the property and assets of the Corporation/Organization otherwise than in the usual and regular course of its business; or revoke any such plan.
- h) Approve any self-dealing transaction, except as provided pursuant to law.

Unless otherwise authorized by the Board of Directors, no committee shall compel the Corporation/Organization in a contract or agreement or expend Corporation/Organization funds.

Meetings and Actions of Committees

Meetings and actions of all committees shall be governed by, and held and taken in accordance with, the provisions of Article 5 - Board of Directors of these bylaws concerning meetings and actions of the directors, with such changes in the context of those bylaws as are necessary to substitute the committee and its members for the Board of Directors and its members, except that the time for regular meetings of committees may be determined either by resolution of the Board of Directors or by resolution of the committee. Special meetings of committees may also be called by resolution of the Board of Directors. Notice of special meetings of committees shall also be given to any and all alternate members, who shall have the right to attend all meetings of the committee. Minutes shall be kept of each meeting of any committee and shall be filed with the Corporation/Organization records. The Board of Directors may adopt rules not consistent with the provisions of these bylaws for the governance of any committee.

If a director relies on information prepared by a committee of the Board on which the director does not serve, the committee must be composed exclusively of any or any combination of (a) directors, (b) directors or employees of the Corporation/Organization whom the director believes to be reliable and competent in the matters presented, or (c) counsel, independent accountants, or other persons as to matters which the director believes to be within that person's professional or expert competence.

Violation of Lovalty - Self-Dealing Contracts

A self-dealing contract is any contract or transaction (i) between this Corporation/Organization and one or more of its Directors, or between this Corporation/Organization and any corporation, firm, or association in which one or more of the Directors has a material financial interest ("Interested Director"), or (ii) between this Corporation/Organization and a corporation, firm, or association of which one or more of its directors are Directors of this Corporation/Organization. Said self-dealing shall not be void or voidable because such Director(s) of corporation, firm, or association are parties or because said Director(s) are present at the meeting of the Board of Directors or committee which authorizes, approves or ratifies the self-dealing contract, if:

- a) All material facts are fully disclosed to or otherwise known by the members of the Board and the self-dealing contract is approved by the Interested Director in good faith (without including the vote of any membership owned by said interested Director(s));
- b) All material facts are fully disclosed to or otherwise known by the Board of Directors or committee, and the Board of Directors or committee authorizes, approves, or ratifies the self-dealing contract in good faith-without counting the vote of the interest Director(s)-and the contract is just and reasonable as to the Corporation/Organization at the time it is authorized, approved, or ratified; or
- c) As to contracts not approved as provided in above sections (a) and/or (b), the person asserting the validity of the self-dealing contract sustains the burden of proving that the contract was just and reasonable as to the Corporation/Organization at the time it was authorized, approved, or ratified.

Interested Director(s) may be counted in determining the presence of a quorum at a meeting of the Board of Directors or a committee thereof, which authorizes, approves, or ratifies a contract or transaction as provided for and contained in this section.

Indemnification

To the fullest extent permitted by law, the Corporation/Organization shall indemnify its "agents," as described by law, including its directors, officers, employees and volunteers, and including persons formerly occupying any such position, and their heirs, executors and administrators, against all expenses, judgments, fines, settlements, and other amounts actually and reasonably incurred by them in connection with any "proceeding," and including any action by or in the right of the Corporation/Organization, by reason of the fact that the person is or was a person as described in the Non-Profit Corporation Act. Such right of indemnification shall not be deemed exclusive of any other right to which such persons may be entitled apart from this Article.

The Corporation/Organization shall have the power to purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of any agent of the Corporation/Organization, to the fullest extent permitted by law, against any liability asserted against or incurred by the agent in such capacity or arising out of the agent's status as such, or to give other indemnification to the extent permitted by law.

ARTICLE 9 - EXECI.1TION OF CORPORATE INSTRUMENTS

Execution of Comorate Instruments

The Board of Directors may, at its discretion, determine the method and designate the signatory officer or officers, or other person or persons, to execute any corporate instrument or document, or to sign the corporate name without limitation, except when otherwise provided by law, and such execution or signature shall be binding upon the Corporation/Organization.

Unless otherwise specifically determined by the Board of Directors or otherwise required by law, formal contracts of the Corporation/Organization, promissory notes, deeds of trust, mortgages, other evidences of indebtedness of the Corporation/Organization, other corporate/organization instruments or documents, memberships in other corporations/organizations, and certificates of shares of stock owned by the Corporation/Organization shall be executed, signed, and/or endorsed by the CEO, President, Secretary.

All checks and drafts drawn on banks or other depositories on funds to the credit of the Corporation/Organization, or in special accounts of the Corporation/Organization, shall be signed by such person or persons as the Board of Directors shall authorize to do so.

Loans and Contracts

No loans or advances shall be contracted on behalf of the Corporation/Organization and no note or other evidence of indebtedness shall be issued in its name unless and except as the specific transaction is authorized by the Board of Directors. Without the express and specific authorization of the Board, no officer or other agent of the Corporation/Organization may enter into any contract or execute and deliver any instrument in the name of and on behalf of the Corporation/Organization.

ARTICLE 10 - RECORDS AND REPORTS

Maintenance and InSJIection of Articles and Bylaws

The Corporation/Organization shall keep at its principal office the original or a copy of its Articles of Incorporation and bylaws as amended to date, which shall be open to inspection by the directors at all reasonable times during office hours.

Maintenance and Inspection of Federal Tax Exemption Application and Annual Information Returns

The Corporation/Organization shall keep at its principal office a copy of its federal tax exemption application and its annual information returns for three years from their date of filing, which shall be open to public inspection and copying to the extent required by law.

Maintenance and InSJlection of Other comorate Records

The Corporation/Organization shall keep adequate and correct books and records of accounts and written minutes of the proceedings of the Board and committees of the Board. All such records shall be kept at a place or places as designated by the Board and committees of the Board, or in the absence of such designation, at the principal office of the Corporation/Organization. The minutes shall be kept in written or typed form, and other books and records shall be kept either in written or typed form or in any form capable of being converted into written, typed, or printed form. Upon leaving office, each officer, employee, or agent of the Corporation/Organization shall turn over to his or her successor or the Chair of the Board or President, in good order, such corporate/organization monies, books, records, minutes, lists, documents, contracts or other property of the Corporation/Organization as have been in the custody of such officer, employee, or agent during his or her term of office.

Every director shall have the absolute right at any reasonable time to inspect all books, records, and documents of every kind and the physical properties of the Corporation/Organization and each of its subsidiary corporations/organizations. The inspection may be made in person or by an agent or attorney, and shall include the right to copy and make extracts of documents.

Preparation of Annual Financial Statements

The Corporation/Organization shall prepare annual financial statements using generally accepted accounting principles. Such statements shall be audited by an independent certified public accountant, in conformity with generally accepted accounting standards. The Corporation/Organization shall make these financial statements available to the California Attorney General and members of the public for inspection no later than 90 days after the close of the fiscal year to which the statements relate.

Reports

The Board shall ensure an annual report is sent to all directors within 90 days after the end of the fiscal year of the Corporation/Organization, which shall contain the following information:

- a) The assets and liabilities, including trust funds, of this corporation at the end of the fiscal year.
- b) The principal changes in assets and liabilities, including trust funds, during the fiscal year.
- c) The expenses or disbursements of the Corporation/Organization for both general and restricted purposes during the fiscal year.
- d) The information required by Non-Profit Corporation Act concerning certain self-dealing transactions involving more than \$50,000 or indemnifications involving more than \$10,000 which took place during the fiscal year.

The report shall be accompanied by any pertinent report from an independent accountant or, if there is no such report, the certificate of an authorized officer of the Corporation/Organization that such statements were prepared without audit from the books and records of the Corporation/Organization.

ARTICLE 11 - FISCAL YEAR

The fiscal year for this Corporation/Organization shall end on December 31.

ARTICLE 12 - AMENDMENTS AND REVISONS

These bylaws may be adopted, amended, or repealed by the vote of a simple majority of the directors then in office. Such action is authorized only at a duly called and held meeting of the Board of Directors for which written notice of such meeting, setting forth the proposed bylaw revisions with explanations therefore, is given in accordance with these bylaws. If any

provision of these bylaws requires the vote of a larger portion of the Board than is otherwise required by law, that provision may not be altered, amended or repealed by that greater vote.

ARTICLE 13 - CORPORATE/ORGANIZATION SEAL

The Board of Directors may adopt, use, and alter a corporate/organization seal. The seal shall be kept at the principal office of the Corporation/Organization. Failure to affix the seal to any corporate/organization instrument, however, shall not affect the validity of that instrument.

ARTICLE 14 - CONSTRUCTION AND DEFINITIONS

Unless the context otherwise requires, the general provisions, rules of construction, and definitions contained in the Non-Profit Corporation Act as amended from time to time shall govern the construction of these bylaws. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the masculine gender includes the feminine and neuter, the singular number includes the plural and the plural number includes the singular, and the term "person" includes a Corporation/Organization as well as a natural person. If any competent court of law shall deem any portion of these bylaws invalid or inoperative, then so far as is reasonable and possible (i) the remainder of these bylaws shall be considered valid and operative, and (ii) effect shall be given to the intent manifested by the portion deemed invalid or inoperative.

GENERAL HEALTH AND SAFETY STANDARDS

Bout Approval

- All bouts proposed will be submitted to the sanction organization and will be evaluated for approval based comparative records and experience.
- Amateur status requires that the athlete HAS NOT competed as a professional (paid to perform) in ANY combat sport or full
 contact martial art. Amateur status is subject to approval of the sanction body.

Fighter Licensing Medical and other Requirements

- Athletes shall be required to submit medical testing including but not limited to; Physicals and Lab Tests meeting the requirements of the California State Athletic Commission for amateur Kickboxers.
- Athletes must have a Federal ID in order to be licensed by ISKA.

Insurance

Promoter will provide for the athletes a Medical and Accidental Death Benefit Policy for Athletes that meets or exceeds the
California State Athletic Commission standard for amateur kickboxers in terms of policy value and minimum deductible.
Claims forms with the promoter information and policy number already written in shall be provided to the ringside physician
prior to the start of the event.

On-Site Medical and Safety Requirements

- All fighters will receive an onsite physical examination clearing them to compete performed by a medical doctor (MD or DO).
 All female fighters will be required to take a pregnancy test. Pregnant women will not be allowed to compete
- All fighters will receive a post-bout physical examination by a medical doctor (MD or DO) who will determine the fighter's disposition and/or medical suspension.
- There will be a minimum of one medical doctor (MD or DO) at ringside during all bouts. . Competition may not occur in the ring if the physician is not present at ringside.
- There will be a minimum of one licensed paramedics and either a second paramedic or EMT's in attendance at the event with
 at least one paramedic present at ringside while competition is occurring. These paramedics/EMT will have in the facility all
 equipment necessary for treatment and or transportation of an injured athlete, including: Oxygen, Backboard and Neck Collar.
- There will be an ambulance (mobile ALS medical unit) on site at all times during the event. If an athlete needs to use the ambulance for transport to the hospital another unit must arrive before the competition can continue.



KICKBOXING RULES AND REGULATIONS

Note that the term "Kickboxing" is used here as a generic term for a great variety of formats and presentations that include but is not limited to:

FULL CONTACT KICKBOXING
ABC UNIFIED RULES KICKBOXING
FREESTYLE RULES KICKBOXING
ORIENTAL RULES KICKBOXING
SAN SHOU/SANDA KICKBOXING
MUAY THAI (KICKBOXING)

ISKA allows promoters a level of discretion concerning the kickboxing format they choose to embrace for their events as long as it meets four important standards:

- 1. All health and safety variables concerning legal and illegal techniques and targets
- 2. Assurance that the athletes have been adequately informed and educated concerning the rules for their contest
- 3. Assurance that all officials can be adequately informed and educated concerning the rules to ensure that they will be able to officiate the bouts with a high level of professional integrity
- 4. The length of each round, the minimum rest period between rounds and the maximum number of rounds is established by the ABC Unified Rules for Amateur Kickboxing

PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT REQUIREMENTS

Athletes shall wear protective gear as required by CSAC and approved by ISKA that shall include, Gloves Mouthguard and Groin Protector (males) and may include Headgear, Elbow Pads and Shin/Instep Protectors.

<u>ATTIRE</u>

Male fighters shall not wear any form of clothing on their upper body. Female fighters shall wear a short sleeved (above the elbow) or sleeveless form fitting rash guard and or sports bra. No loose-fitting tops shall be allowed. All Fighters shall wear approved shorts/trunks. The hem of the trunks may not extend below the mid-thigh. Long pants or leggings are prohibited except for FULL CONTACT style kickboxing. Compression shorts may be worn under the approved fight trunks, but they may not extend down the leg below the bottom of the trunks. Fighting shorts/trunks, and sports bras, shall not have exposed Velcro, clasps, pockets, zippers, or other items that may be harmful to the fighter or their opponent. Fighters shall not wear shoes in the cage or ring.



UNIFIED RULES OF AMATEUR KICKBOXING

- 1. Bouts may consist of a maximum of ten (9) rounds of two (2) minutes each in duration, with a minimum of one (1) minute rest period between each round.
- 2. The referee and/or the ringside physician are the only individuals authorized to stop the contest, as determined by the presiding commission. This rule shall not preclude a video or other review of a decision under the procedures of the applicable regulatory authority if a protest is filed claiming a clear rule violation.
- 3. All bouts are evaluated and scored by three (3) judges.

4. Scoring:

- A. The 10 Point Must System will be the standard system of scoring a bout. Under the 10 Point Must Scoring System, 10 points must be awarded to the winner of the round.
- B. The fighter who has lost the round may be awarded 9, 8, or 7 points.
- C. If the round is determined to be an even round, a score of 10/10 may be awarded.
- D. Partial or incomplete rounds will be scored. If no significant action has occurred, the round shall be scored as an even round. This is at the discretion of the judges.

Scoring Criteria:

Bouts will be evaluated using the following prioritized criteria;

- 1. Number of Knockdowns.
- 2. Cumulative effective Impact on the Opponent.
- 3. Number of Clean Scoring Strikes
- 4. Ring Generalship or Aggressiveness
- 5. In the event of a knockdown the referee shall send the standing fighter to a neutral corner and administer a Mandatory Eight (8) Count to the downed fighter.

A knockdown is defined as when a fighter touches the mat with anything other than the souls of their feet as the result of a legal, damaging strike – or is in a defenseless position grabbing the opponent, or hanging on or over the ropes. The referee will have sole discretion in determining a knockdown versus a slip.

If a fighter goes down from what the referee indicates is a "slip" but fails to rise after the referee's repeated commands, the referee will initiate a count, and follow the procedures of a knockdown. If the fighter does not rise at the count of 10, it will be considered a TKO.

If a fighter injures him/herself and then fails to intelligently defend him/herself by turning their back on the opponent, the referee may, in the proper exercise of their discretion either treat the injury the same as one produced by a fair blow from the opponent and follow the procedures for a knockdown, or terminate the bout and declare the opponent winner by TKO.

- 6. The Three (3) Knockdown Rule is in effect only where a fighter has been knocked down 3 times in the same round by strikes/kicks to the head. In this event, this fighter shall be determined to have lost the bout by **TECHNICAL KNOCKOUT** (note that "standing eight (8) counts are considered the same as knockdowns in making this determination).
- 7. The use of the "Standing Eight (8) Count is allowed in order to provide the referee the opportunity to make best determination regarding if a damaged fighter should be allowed to continue in the match.
- 8. A fighter who has been knocked down CANNOT be saved by the bell in any round, including the final round.
- 9. All fighters are required to wear a mouthpiece during any contest. No round can begin without the mouthpieces in place. If any mouthpiece becomes dislodged during the contest, the referee shall call time and have the mouthpiece rinsed and put back in the fighter's mouth at the first opportune moment, without interfering with the action. The referee may deduct points if he/she feels the mouthpiece is being intentionally dislodged.
- 10. A fighter shall receive a 20 second count if the fighter is knocked out of the ring and onto the floor. The fighter shall <u>NOT</u> be assisted by anyone, including spectators or his seconds. If the fighter is assisted, he may be deducted points, or disqualified, at the sole discretion of the referee. If the fighter falls or is thrown from the ring the referee shall "stop time", allow the fighter to return, seek the council of the ringside physician and/or penalize the other fighter if there was a fouling action, where appropriate.

11. Fouls:

- A. Head butts.
- B. Groin strikes.
- C. Thrusting or Linear kicks directed at the knee joint
- D. Striking the back of the head or the spine defined as striking any of the area beginning at the back of the head starting at the crown of the head and running directly down the center of the head, spreading from ear to ear in the back of the head, running down the entire rear portion of the neck, and beginning again at the occipital junction and stopping at the top of the trapezius, and again from the trapezius muscle down the spine to the tailbone
- E. Attacks to the throat.
- F. Striking a downed fighter (a fighter is considered "down" whenever they have any part of their body other than the soles of their feet touching the canvas).
- G. Failure to obey the referee's commands.
- H. Striking on a break.
- I. Striking after a bell.
- J. Holding or using the ropes while striking or clinching.
- K. Timidity: Repeatedly, intentionally avoiding engagement or contact with the opponent.

- L. Use of abusive language and/or gestures.
- M. Causing intentional delays in the action: For example, repeatedly spitting out the mouth piece, falling out of the ring to cause delay.
- N. Thumbing
- O. Holding the opponent's leg without executing a legal strike or while executing more than one striking technique. (A fighter may grab the opponent's kicking leg and immediately execute one legal strike while taking one step, and then they must immediately release the leg.)
- P. Any effort to down a fighter by a method other than a legal strike or strikes; this includes, but is not limited to joint locks, submission attempts, sweeps, reaps, takedowns and throws.
- Q. Biting.
- R. Spiting at the opponent.
- S. Striking with the elbow, arm, wrist, or other part of the glove that is not the padded part of the glove
- T. Holding, which is defined as repeatedly grabbing, grasping or tying up an opponent in order to prevent the opponent from striking. Clinching is allowed in order to immediately launch a credible knee attack. If in the referee's estimation the attack and/or counter knee attack is consistent and effective, he may allow it to continue for up to five seconds at which point he will separate the fighters. If within the five seconds the knee attack or counter-attack wanes or appears ineffective the referee will immediately separate the fighters.
- U. Striking with the knee to the opponent's head

12. Permissible Strikes:

- A. All boxing strikes to permissible target areas.
- B. Spinning backhands/fists to permissible target areas
- C. Knee strikes to permissible target areas
- D. All kicking strikes to permissible targets above the belt line
- E. All kicking Strikes executed with the foot or shin directed to the legs (excluding linear or thrusting kicks directed to the knee joint.

<u>Permissible target areas</u>: a) front and sides of the head (except for knee strikes); b) front and sides of the torso above the belt; c) entire leg, except the knee joint by thrusting or linear kicks.

13. The winner of a match may be decided in the following ways:

- A. Points Decision: When both contestants finish the scheduled rounds, victory is awarded by majority decision of the judging panel.
- B. Knockout: If a contestant is incapable of resuming the fight within the referee's ten-count due to legal strikes.
- C. Technical Knockout:
 - 1. If the official determines a contestant shows no will to, or is incapable of resuming the fight due to a legal technique
 - 2. If the official determines the contestant can longer intelligently defend him/herself
 - 3. If the contestant does not leave his corner to take part in the fight following the sounding of the bell.
 - 4. If the referee is of the opinion that one contestant is outmatched by the opponent and continuing the match would jeopardize the athlete's health and safety
 - 5. If the bout is terminated for medical reasons due to injury resulting from a legal technique.
 - 6. Where an athlete's corner indicates to the official they no longer wish to continue the contest and "throws in the towel") If a contestant or his coach/corner man gives up the fight. The contestant or his coach/corner man will indicate this to the referee or the regulatory representative assigned to his corner (The corner "throws in the towel").

D. Disqualification:

- 1. The referee disqualifies the fighter for any reason including intentional, deliberate, flagrant or repeated fouling.
- 2. The referee disqualifies the fighter if anyone from their corner enters the ring during the bout or touches one of the fighters during the contest, other than during the rest period, or when permitted by the commission representative.

E. Draw:

- 1. If following the end of all rounds, at least two of the three judges do not pronounce one of the fighters a winner.
- 2. If both fighters go down at the same time and neither can resume the fight within the referee's ten-count.

F. No Decision:

- 1. If a fighter cannot continue as the result of an accidental foul and the bell has not yet sounded completing the second round of a three round bout, or completed the third round of a five round bout, or completed the fourth round of a bout scheduled for more than five rounds.
- 2. If the referee decides both fighters must be disqualified
- 3. Where the commission determines any other determination would result in a miscarriage of justice.
- 14. A fighter who has been struck with a low blow is allowed up to five minutes to recover from the foul as long as in the referee and/or ringside doctor's opinion the fighter may continue on in the contest. If the fighter states that they can continue on before the five minutes of time have expired, the referee shall as soon as practical restart the fight. If the fighter goes over the five (5) minute time allotment, the fight cannot be restarted, and the contest must come to an end with the outcome determined by the round and time in which the fight was stopped.

15. Injuries Sustained by Intentional Fouls:

- A. If an intentional foul causes an injury, which is severe enough to terminate the bout immediately, the fighter causing the foul shall lose by DISQUALIFICATION.
- B. If the referee determines that a contest may continue despite an injury caused by an intentional foul, the referee shall immediately inform the Commission's representative and the judges and the judges shall deduct the points as determined by the referee and/or the commission's representative
- C. If an injury caused by an intentional foul results in the contest being stopped later in the bout, or in a later round:
 - (i) If the injured fighter is ahead on the scorecards, he shall be declared the winner by a **TECHNICAL DECISION**, or
 - (ii) If the injured fighter is behind or even on the scorecards, the contest shall be declared a **TECHNICAL DRAW**.
- D. If a fighter injures himself while attempting to foul his opponent, but is able to continue fighting, the referee shall take no action and treat the injury as if produced by a fair blow. If the referee determined fighter who injured him/herself is unable to continue, that fighter will lose by **TECHNICAL KNOCKOUT/KNOCKOUT.**
- 16. Injuries Sustained By <u>Unintentional</u> Fouls:

- A. If an unintentional foul causes an injury, which is severe enough to terminate the bout immediately, the contest shall result in a **NO DECISION**, if a bout has not completed the rounds necessary to score a technical decision.
- B. If an unintentional foul causes an injury severe enough to terminate the bout once the bout is considered official, the bout shall be awarded to the fighter ahead on the scorecards, including incomplete rounds, by way of a **TECHNICAL DECISION**.

A bout is considered "official" if completing the second round of a three round bout, or completed the third round of a five round bout, or completed the fourth round of a bout scheduled for more than five rounds.

If the injury from the UNINTENTIONAL foul is not severe enough to immediately stop the bout but later becomes aggravated and causes the bout to be be stopped, the bout shall be awarded to the fighter ahead on the scorecards, including incomplete rounds, by way of a TECHNICAL DECISION if the bout has been official. Otherwise the bout will result in a NO DECISION.

- C. If a fighter injures themselves while attempting to intentionally foul their opponent:
 - (i) and is able to continue fighting, the referee will not take any action;
 - (ii) If the referee feels that a fighter has conducted themselves in an unsportsmanlike manner, the referee may stop the bout and disqualify the fighter
 - (iii) If the offending fighter fails to intelligently defend him/herself by turning their back on the opponent, the referee may, in the proper exercise of their discretion, either treat the injury the same as one produced by a fair blow from the opponent and follow the procedures for a knockdown, or terminate the bout and declare the opponent winner by TKO.
- 17. 10 oz. and 12 oz. boxing gloves are the industry standard for amateur kickboxing. All issues pertaining to mandatory and optional equipment, including protective headgear and/or shin and instep protectors will be determined by the presiding commission.
- 18. Male contestants must not wear clothing or other attire on their upper bodies. Female contestants must wear short sleeved (above the elbow) form fitting tops or a sports bra.
- 19. No fighter may leave the ring before the end of the bout. Should the fighter fail to resume the bout following the end of the rest period, the referee shall begin counting as though there were a knockdown. At the conclusion of the count, the opponent shall be awarded the bout by way of **TECHNICAL KNOCKOUT**.

A: FULL CONTACT KICKBOXING (FC) RULES

Legitimate targets include all areas of the body above the waist except the spine neck or back of the head, techniques include all punching techniques connecting with the knuckle part of the glove, all kicks, roundhouse front, side, spinning, back, jump connecting with the instep, heel, ball or side of the foot and the shin.

FOULS (In addition to those in section 6, FOULS)

Striking or kicking any area below the waist.

Grabbing or holding an opponent's foot or leg, followed by a take down, strike or kick.

Leg checking in extending the leg to check an opponent's leg to prevent him from kicking.

SWEEPING

In Full Contact matches, sweeps must be executed with the arch of the foot and delivered to the outside or inside part of the leg, and only to the lower portion of the calf or ankle. The sweeping technique must be an obvious attempt to unbalance the opponent's front leg, and must clearly not be an attempt to injure the leg. It is the fighter's choice whether or not to follow-up his legal sweeping attempt. Follow-up techniques must land on the opponent prior to any part of his body touching the floor (other than the soles of his feet). As always, striking a downed opponent is illegal. A successful sweep is not considered a knockdown.

CONTINUAL KICKING RULE

There is no Minimum Kick Count under ISKA Full Contact Kickboxing rules. Each Fighter must continually kick throughout the round. If a Fighter kicks ten times in the first thirty seconds, and does not kick for the next ninety seconds, they haven't continually kicked. A fair ratio of Kicks to Punches must be used throughout the whole round.

Legal kicks are considered those which are attempts to land hard on a target area of the opponent's body, with the intent to do damage, or any legitimate attempt to kick the head.

If a fighter is deemed by the Referee or Judges to have failed to continually kick throughout a round , the referee will give a caution or a <u>public warning that must be announce by the MC (Master of Ceremonies)</u>. After the first Public warning the referee will deduct points at his discretion. If a fighter deliberately breaks the Continual Kicking Rule he may be disqualified

If both fighters should simultaneously fail to meet their Continual Kicking Rule as described above, the bout would be stopped and declared a no contest

ATTIRE

The uniform must include long pants that reach the ankle, Shinpads of soft substance, regulation gloves and foot protective equipment approved by the ISKA.

Further information can be found in Section 4, Fighter; equipment and seconds, units 1. & 2

B: FREESTYLE KICKBOXING (FR) RULES

ECHNIQUES

The number of clean Kickboxing techniques striking a legitimate target or used successfully against an opponent, techniques include all punching techniques connecting with the knuckle part of the glove, all kicks, roundhouse front, side, spinning, back, jump connecting with the instep, heel, ball or side of the foot and the shin.

Legitimate targets include all areas of the body above the waist except the spine neck or back of the head. Under Freestyle kickboxing rules low kicks are allowed to the inside and outside of the calf and thigh.

Notes:

With regards to the <u>CKR</u> rule faints and flicks kicks do not count Kicks that are attempted real attacks but are blocked or deflected do count

FOULS (In addition to those in section 6, FOULS)

Grabbing or holding an opponent's foot or leg, followed by a take down, strike or kick. Leg checking in extending the leg to check an opponent's leg to prevent him from kicking.

SCORING

The kicker will always have the advantage

If one contestant attempts to score kicks above the waist and the other opponent only uses boxing techniques, the Kicker must have the advantage and win the round.

Notes:

The winner of a bout is the competitor who successfully delivers more effective techniques than their opponent whether moving forwards, backwards, sideways or against the ropes

If the number of strikes scored by each competitor is equal, and one competitor was clearly more proactive in attempting above the waist kicking to attack during the bout, they should win the round.

If the number of strikes scored by each competitor is equal and no contestant has clearly attacked more, the contestant who shows better offensive skill or counterattacking skills wins the round.

If contestants are otherwise equal and one contestant clearly fouls consistently, that contestant who violates the rules loses the round.

If both contestants score an equal number of strikes, the contestant who lands more effective or damaging strikes should be awarded the round.

C: ORIENTAL RULES (OR) RULES

TECHNIQUES

Oriental Riles is where Kickboxing and Muaythai meet, striking technique from both arts are allowed except elbow and forearm

Legitimate targets include all areas of the body except the groin, spine neck or back of the head.

Notes:

Clinching must include effective attack Clinching or neck wrestling without attempt to attack will not score

All techniques score equality

All striking techniques will score the same whether a punch knee or kick to the legs or body, only the more effective or damaging techniques score higher.

D: MUAYTHAI RULES (MT) RULES (NOTE: ISKA will adopt the ABC UNIFIED RULES FOR AMATUER MUAY THAI expected to be ratified in July 2024)

TECHNIQUES

The number of clean Muaythai techniques striking a legitimate target or used successfully against an opponent Muaythai techniques include all punching techniques using the fist and forearm, all elbow strikes, all knee strikes, round kicks, front, side and back push kicks and Muaythai throws

Legitimate targets include all areas of the body except the back of the head, spine, throat and deliberately striking the groin area, the tibia (shin) when used in a blocking action and the forearm again used in a blocking action.

The effectiveness of the techniques

Effective techniques are defined as Muaythai techniques delivered on balance and have a physical effect on a competitor. To be considered effective techniques (strikes or throwing actions) need i) To cause a loss of a competitor's balanced position (they are moved physically either due to the power of the strike, good timing or because of a competitor's loss of balance) or ii) cause them to show physical or psychological distress (showing fear or pain). iii) Round kicks delivered with force cleanly hitting the body or neck are considered effective even without causing loss of position, similarly straight knee strikes or circle knees delivered with force and striking with the point of the knee also are considered effective without obvious effect iv) Elbow strikes that cut are considered effective without any other obvious effect v) If a contestant kicks an opponent on target, but that kicking leg is caught by their opponent the kicker scores a point. However if after their kick is caught they get kicked to they are kicked down to the canvas the contestant kicking their opponent to the canvas scores as well. However, if the kicker with his kicking leg caught by an opponent pretends to fall down on the ring floor, they are considered guilty of violating the rules. In this case, no boxer scores a point

Notes:

The winner of a bout is the competitor who successfully delivers more effective techniques than their opponent whether moving forwards, backwards, sideways or against the ropes.

If the number of strikes scored by each competitor is equal, and one competitor was clearly more proactive in attempting to attack during the bout, they should win the bout

If the number of strikes scored by each competitor is equal and no contestant has clearly attacked more, the contestant who shows better offensive skills, defensive skills, elusive skills, or counterattacking skills using Muay Thai arts and techniques wins the bout

If contestants are otherwise equal and one contestant clearly fouls consistently, that contestant who violates the rules loses the bout

If neither competitor delivers any effective strikes the boxer who lands more ineffective strikes should be awarded the bout

The judges are attempting to award the contest to the contestant who has one the whole fight using the scoring principles and criteria highlighted and award points that reflect that

If a round is considered too close to award the round clearly by one point (10:9), the judge may make a mental note or mark as a reminder of the contestant who edged the round, so it can be considered in scoring the contest

MUAY THAI ABBRV NOTES:

- Bouts will be scheduled for a maximum of five (5), 2-minutes rounds with one (1) minute rest period The referee and/or the ringside physician are the only individuals authorized to stop the contest.
- All bouts are evaluated and scored by three (3) judges using the 10-point-must system with the following prioritized criteria. Number of Knockdowns. 2. Cumulative effective Impact on the Opponent.3. Number of Clean Scoring Strikes 4. Ring Control or Aggressiveness
- In the event of a knockdown the referee shall send the standing fighter to a neutral corner and administer a Mandatory Eight (8) Count to the downed fighter.

- The referee may issue a "Standing Eight (8) Count" which shall be scored identical to a knock-down. The Three (3) Knockdown Rule is in effect only where a fighter has been knocked down 3 times in the same round by strikes to the head
- A fighter who has been knocked down CANNOT be saved by the bell in any round, including the final round. Adult male contestants must not wear clothing or other attire on their upper bodies. Female contestants must wear approved short sleeved (above the elbow) form fitting tops or a sports bra. All fighters are required to wear a mouthpiece during any contest. All male fighters will wear an approved groin protector. All fighters will wear elbow/forearm pads for bouts where elbow strikes are approved. Adult novice fighters shall wear approved headgear and shin/instep pads. When either fighter weighs 154 lbs. or more, both fighters will wear approved 12 oz boxing gloves. When both fighters weigh less than 154 lbs. both fighters may wear approved 10 oz boxing gloves. All fighters shall be allowed to wear prajed (traditional Muay Thai arm bands)

Fouls (including but not limited to:

- NO striking the back of the head
- NO striking the spine
- NO striking the groin
- NO sweeps w/ back or side of leg
- NO hip tosses/Judo throws
- NO picking up opponent & slamming onto canvas
- NO head-butts
- NO hammer fists
- NO Plowing (If you catch a leg you can take one step then you must strike and release)

All of the above are considered fouls. If a referee determines a foul is intentional a point will be deducted. If the referee determines a foul is unintentional a warning will be given for the first instance. Subsequent fouls will receive point deductions. A downed opponent has up to 5 minutes to recover due to a foul (at referee discretion). The Referee reserves the right to end a fight due to subsequent fouls if it is in the best interest of the fighter.

LEGAL STRIKES:

Punching Strikes: All Levels; All punches of boxing are allowed to the body and head. This is to include the jab, cross, hook, uppercut, overhand and spinning back fist. NO punches are ever allowed to the back of the head!

Elbow Strikes:

Elbows to the body and head are allowed.

Knee Strikes:

Knees to the body and legs are allowed, knees to the head are not allowed.

Kicking Strikes:

All types of kicks are allowed to the body and head except no direct attacks to the knees.

Clinching:

Clinching is allowed for all fighters. All strikes (as applicable above) can be used.

A fighter may NOT pull down the head (as knees to the head are not allowed). The referee will allow fighters to work in the clinch to gain position. Excessive clinching without strikes will be broken up by the referee.

Throws:

Throws from the clinch range are allowed. These must be done with the arms, knees and legs to off balance an opponent and "dump" or "throw". Judo throws, hip tosses, take downs, or body slams are NOT allowed. You may not pick up an opponent to body slam as seen in MMA. No "tripping" is allowed. A fighter may not intentionally fall on top of their opponent to cause injury. ALL sweeps must be done with the use of the front of the shin.

E: K-1 RULES (K-1)

TECHNIQUES

Awarding of points shall be based on the following elements

Whether an effective and accurate attack is acknowledged and damage is inflicted on the opponent using legal techniques.

Notes:

Under K-1 Rules all strikes, punches kick or knees are only valued by the damage they inflict, strikes landed without power have no value.

The aggressor the fighter who is pushing forwards will have the advantage if the number of strikes scored by each fighter is equal, and one fighter was clearly more proactive in attempting to attack, should win the fight


Points will be awarded in this priority:
Number of downs
Extent of damage inflicted on the opponent
Number of clean hits
Degree of aggressiveness (points in the offensive)

If contestants are otherwise equal and one contestant clearly fouls consistently, that contestant who violates the rules loses the round.

F: SANDA / SAN SHOU / CHINESE KICKBOXING

BOUT PARAMETERS

- 1. Bouts will be evaluated by three judges based on the relative effectiveness of each Sanda Fighter. They will evaluate the effective results of each fighter's legal techniques (rather than award points for specific actions). Knockdowns, Effective Strikes, Successful Throws/Takedowns and Clean Scoring Strikes earn judge's favor.
- 2. **Legal techniques include** punching with the padded part of the glove, kicking with the foot and shin, and pushing/throwing/wrestling techniques.
- 3. Legal targets include the head, the front and sides of the torso and the thighs (above the knees)
- 4. **Fouls include (but are not limited to)** Attacking or striking with the head, elbow or knee, attacking a joint, submission holds of any kind, piledriving or slamming the opponents to the mat, striking the groin or the spine, and/or striking a downed opponent in any manner.
- 5. **No holding**. Fighters may **clinch** to attempt a legal throw or takedown. Clinching repeatedly without executing successful throws may lead to penalization.
- 6. Spinning backfist is allowed but contact must be made with the **padded** part (back/front) of the glove.
- 7. **Maximum Knockdown/Standing 8 Count Rules**: In a quarter or semi-final bout; two in a round or three in a bout leads to an automatic TKO. In a final bout in a round or four in a bout leads to an automatic TKO.
- 8. **Forced Out of Bounds** If during a round, a competitor has been forced out of bounds two times, the round will end and the opponent will be declared the winner of that round.
- **9.** The **referee** is the sole arbiter of each bout and has full authority to caution, warn, penalize, or disqualify fighters, as well as terminate a bout due to disparate skills.

The events were held in San Diego and Vacaville.



BACKGROUND

Due to the successful efforts made last year by the Commission to reunite late claimants with their owed boxers pension distribution, the suspense account, which is used to pay the late claimants, is retaining less funds. Currently, the suspense account is funded by retaining 20% of the forfeited amount from covered boxers who don't make a pension claim before they turn 53. The other 80% of the forfeited amount is then reallocated to active boxers who have an account balance.

The plan administrator, Benefit Resources, is requesting for the Commission to increase the percentage amount that is retained in the suspense account in order to be able to pay out claims made by late claimants. The memo prepared by Benefit Resources is included in the meeting materials for your review.

RECOMMENDATION

I recommend that the Commission increase the percentage amount that is retained in the suspense account to 25% and for the Commission to allow the Executive Officer to increase the percentage amount that is retained in the suspense account to a maximum of 35% if requested by Benefit Resources. In order for Benefit Resources to request an increase above 25%, detailed documentation and consultation by Benefit Resources would be required.

I. STATE OF CALIFORNIA ATHLETIC COMMISSION PROFESSIONAL BOXERS' PENSION PLAN (THE "PLAN") IS "NON-QUALIFIED"

• Assets are not eligible for rollover, therefore taxable upon account distribution

II. REVIEW OF PLAN FINANCIAL STATEMENTS


- 281 Covered boxers for a total of \$3.659M in plan assets
- Plan assets at the end of 2023 were \$4.596M, roughly the same as they were at the beginning
- Investment returns and dividends totaled \$528,030
- Promoter contributions were \$92,245
- Distributions totaled \$565,006
 - Of these, \$409,433 were issued to boxers whose accounts needed to be reinstated (a.k.a., "Late Claimants", "LC")
- Service provider fees were 0.47% of end of year assets
- Administrative expenses were 1.03% compared to end of year assets
- Suspense account has \$23,819
- Unfunded liability of accounts attributable to Late Claimants totals \$1.839M

V. REVIEW OF SUSPENSE ACCOUNT ACTIVITY

- 2023 experienced a shortfall in assets available to fund distribution requests from Late Claimants
 - o \$409,433 requested but only \$293,779 available
 - o Shortfall was funded by current year forfeitures primarily from Covered boxers but also in part from those who experienced a break in service (a.k.a., "BIS")
- Currently, 20% of forfeitures from Covered boxers are retained by the Suspense account, the remainder typically reallocated to active boxers

VI. REVIEW OF PLAN PROVISIONS REGARDING FORFEITURES

- Covered/vested boxers are those who have met the requirements
 - o 10 scheduled CA rounds in last 36 months (failure results in a BIS which means account is forfeited), and
 - o 75 scheduled lifetime CA rounds without a BIS, and
 - 4 calendar years with 10 scheduled rounds
- Covered boxers are eligible to take a distribution of their account once statements are available for the plan year they turned 50
- Covered boxer accounts are forfeited if a distribution is not requested before the end of the year they turn 53
 - o Boxer becomes classified as a Late Claimant
 - Account is still promised to the boxer if/when a distribution request is eventually made, which comes from the Suspense account

- o In the past, some of the current year forfeitures from Covered boxers has been used to cover a shortfall in the Suspense account
- This approach likely insufficient considering uptick in distribution activity

VII. PLAN DOCUMENT UPDATES ARE RECOMMENDED

- Provide a clear and thorough solution to the potential recurrence of a Suspense account shortfall (i.e., where the money should come from)
- Attempt to prevent a shortfall in the first place, such as:
 - o Adjusting the forfeiture retention strategy
 - o Limiting Late Claimant distribution activity each year
 - o Establishing an age after which late claims are not honored

According to the Raymond James statement, the Pension Investment account has approximately \$4.495 million dollars as of May 31, 2024.

The Commission has 3 Inspector vacancies, the job posting for those vacancies closed on May 28, 2024, and the Commission will start conducting interviews in the coming weeks.

The first Bare Knuckle Fighting Championship Event in California was held on April 27th at the Peacock Theater in Los Angeles. It was regulated by 14 athletic inspectors, the Assistant Chief Athletic Inspector, 5 referees, 6 judges, 2 timekeepers, 4 ringside physicians, and myself. Four Commissioners were in attendance and provided valuable feedback and policy oversight.

There were no serious injuries to report. One athlete dislocated his arm, and it was reset at the hospital after transport by the onsite ambulance. The doctors treated 17 lacerations onsite immediately at the conclusion of the bouts.

Items We Can Improve On

1) This was our first Bare Knuckle Event and the refereeing from CSAC based officials was not as good as I had hoped. Specifically, identification of knockdowns and fouls are important areas to work toward improvement. We also need to provide a more detailed rules meeting and more individual rules meetings with the fighters so more questions can be asked. As a reminder, this is a very new sport and many fighters are not aware of the nuances of holding/clenching, knockdowns, etc. Our Timekeepers need to treat this sport as they do MMA and ring the bell on the referee's instructions. That will happen moving forward.

Items BKFC can Improve On

- 1) The promotion must pay attention to the bout contracts when completing them. We allowed a change to a contract to occur, at the fighter's request, about an hour before that fighter walked out. The fighter claimed his signed contract was supposed to be \$100,000 when the contract we had was \$200,000. This turned out to be a simple mistake by the matchmaker of BKFC who took full responsibility, but had the fighter not been honest, CSAC would have enforced the \$200,000.
- 2) Muzzi, the Promotion Physician, will remain off the ring apron and only consult with CSAC physicians if requested.

3) I would request more "give" or "flexibility in the ring ropes". They felt very hard.

Items CSAC did well

- 1) The ringside physicians did an amazing job with the speed and quality that they sewed up the lacerations.
- 2) The inspectors were very attentive to detail at the weigh in and event and tested all 24 athletes with full World Anti-Doping Agency steroid panels. The results will be back in about 2 weeks.
- 3) CSAC Completed 20 C3Logix tests on BKFC athletes.

Items BKFC did well

- 1) The event was professional and first class.
- 2) Every part of the event had the markings of a world class promotion. All the BKFC staff from Adam, Sean, and Nate to the others took CSAC direction well and were a pleasure to work with.
- 3) BKFC had good communication before, during, and after the event.
- 4) BKFC sold out, helping the local economy and paying CSAC a hefty regulatory fee.

In conclusion, I would recommend keeping this as a pilot program for at least the next year or longer. The sport of bare knuckle is fast and new, and we have a lot of learning to do, but the officials, inspectors, and staff are optimistic this can be a professional and positive sport. I will use the authority given to me by the Commission on December 9th to approve their next event on July 12 so they can begin to promote after I send this report. My final report will be issued at the June 10th meeting.




Value Over Time



III. Membership Information

Standard Memberships

Membership fees are calculated by LBC. USA Boxing collects a standard amount of \$55.00 – \$75.00, per athlete membership and \$75.00 for each non-athlete membership (amounts vary by location). 


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
